• Very similar to Google Maps, this website plots a variety of crimes on a map so citizens can see what offenses are occurring in surrounding neighborhoods, in prospective towns, or across the United States.

What specific tools are available to use on this website?

Date Range: Select a time frame of data (works best for 1 year or less).
Event: Choose which offenses (Burglary, Vandalism, etc) to view.
Offenders: See where Sexual Offenders reside.
Density Map: Plot "Heat Maps" (areas of high and low concentration of offenses).
Agency Layers: Pick which police agencies' offenses/offenders to view or ignore.

UCR Part 1 Offenses:

The <u>Uniform Crime Reporting</u>, or UCR, program was started by the FBI in an effort to develop a uniform system of reporting police crime statistics across the nation based on population.

Part 1 Crimes are classified by specific guidelines breaking down major crimes into seven categories; murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft.

These seven major crimes provide a standardized reporting system for the crime rates throughout the United States.

2017 Major Crime UCR - Crimes Against Property

COMMERICAL BURGLARIES

- Unlawful entry of a business (non-residential) building with the intent to commit a felony or theft
- 60 offenses occurred

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

- Unlawful entry of an apartment, hotel room, or house with the intent to commit a felony or theft
- 51 offenses occurred

BURGLARY OF MOTOR VEHICLES

- Unlawful entry of a motor vehicle with the intent to commit a felony or theft
- 245 offenses occurred


THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLES

- The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle
 - 96 offenses occurred

ALL OTHER THEFT


- Attempting to or successfully taking property through deception, fraud, or other nonviolent methods
 - 340 offenses occurred



UCR Crimes and Clearance Rates






What do the Metrocrest's crime and clearance rates look like over the years?

- Carrollton has the highest number of UCR crimes committed, followed by Addison and Farmers Branch. Coppell has the lowest number.
- Addison has the highest percentage of UCR crimes cleared by detectives; Farmers Branch and Carrollton follow. Coppell has the has the lowest number.
- For 2016, Addison has the highest clearance rate and the second most crimes.


2017 Major Crime Where Are Area-Wide UCR Crimes Happening?




Map includes Addison, Carrollton, Farmers Branch, and Far North Dallas (north of 635, west of 75)

2017 Major Crime Where Are Addison UCR Crimes Happening?




Calls for Service Locations Residential VS Commercial

Calls for Service Locations Hotels VS All Other Calls





Breakdown of Hotels Statistics

- 23 hotels
- 4121 rooms
- Approximately 2 people per room
- At 100% occupancy: around **8,200** people staying in hotels
- At 60% occupancy: around **4,900** people staying in hotels
- Addison's resident population is around 16,000 people
 - 9% of calls from service originate from up to one third of Addison's total bedroom population



Patrol and Criminal Investigation Division Highlights

On March 2, patrol officers discovered a no-bond parole violation warrant issued for one male after performing a computer check of his vehicle.

Two handguns, over 450 grams of methamphetamine, Xanax, marijuana, and \$2,229.00 in cash were seized from the vehicle and federal charges were filed.



A routine patrol of a hotel parking lot on October 12 led to an extensive fraud investigation by officers and detectives.

After finding a stolen vehicle with narcotics and a handgun in plain view, a search warrant was written for a related hotel room.

Dozens of pieces of identifying information and forged documents were recovered.

Early in the morning on April 25, a citizen noticed two males pulling on car door handles in a local parking garage. One male was immediately detained but the second male took off running.

An extended foot pursuit led Addison and Dallas officers to a wooded area where the second male was found hiding. He was placed under arrest for Evading.

Officers continued to search the parking garage and found a third male pulling on more handles. He was immediately detained.

A recovered knife and sunglasses were returned to a local resident by officers, who called the resident to let him know about his vehicle being burglarized.



Officers working on patrol on May 25 made a traffic stop on a vehicle for expired registration. An investigation began after signs of narcotics use in the vehicle were observed.

Three handguns, over 100 grams of methamphetamine, heroin, cocaine, and \$2,331 were seized from the vehicle.


Animal Control — A Year in Review
