

## Clean & Show Inspection Requirements

## Clean & Show (Electric)

- 1. All electrical fixtures, outlets and switches must be installed and be in a safe condition for the Electric Meter Release.
- 2. If a fixture, outlet or switch will be installed by a future tenant or at a later date, the wiring must be terminated properly. Proper termination includes installing wire nuts on each conductor, placing the wires inside of an approved junction box and installing a cover on the junction box. No exposed electrical connections are allowed.
- 3. All open spaces in the electrical panel where circuit breakers have been removed or breaker knockouts have been removed require the installation of panel blanks or spare breakers.
- 4. The meter base must be labeled with the address and/or suite number for the space. The labeling must be done with permanent materials. Magic marker or Sharpie markings are not acceptable.
- 5. All panel and/or junction box knockouts must have aproved/listed knockout plugs (push pennies) installed.
- 6. GFCI protected outlets are required within 6ft of a sink, lavatory, drinking fountain or other plumbing fixture or water outles. Proper operation of the GFCI will be confirmed once power has been turned on and Certificate of Occupancy inspection is performed.
- 7. All connections to electrical appliances must be connected properly to the appliance with no visible conductors.

## Clean & Show (Gas)

1. Gas is not released with a Clean & Show permit. If a gas meter release is required, a licensed plumber must obtain a permit for a gas test. Information regarding Gas Meter release requirements can be found in the Requirements for Gas Service Release Information Packet.
