



Second in Command; Safety & Privacy Officer; Manages and directs the activities and operations of the department to include EM Coordinator emergency response, EMS, training, & employee development.

David Jones Fire Chief

Head of Department; Plans, organizes, directs, and monitors all fire department operations.

Sheri Baldwin Inspector/ Investigator

Inspects public, commercial & industrial facilities: Identifies & enforces code compliance; Investigates fire & hazmat incidents; Coordinates Public Education.

Monica Hernandez Admin Supervisor

Supports the Fire Chief; Program Manager; Process evaluation & improvement; Grant Administrator; Data Analysis; Supervises Dept Assistant.

- Many of our members were recognized professionally through education programs, leadership programs, or by their engagement with the community.











































TYPE & NUMBER OF INCIDENTS

NOT REPRESENTED IN PIE GRAPH: OVERPRESSURE/OVERHEAT-NO FIRE (2) 0.05%












DISPATCH TO ON SCENE AVERAGE RESPONSE TIME


Addison - 5 Year Comparison


