Council Updates

Moody's Upgrades Addison's Credit Rating to Aaa

Addison has had an AAA credit rating from Standard and Poor's, but we are pleased to announced that Moody's is upgrading our rating from Aa1 to Aaa, the highest rating they issue. According to Moody's <u>press release</u>, the upgrade to Aaa reflects a sustained history of healthy financial operations supported by conservative planning and budgeting practices. It goes on to say that the stable rating outlook reflects the Town's healthy local economy that should continue to benefit in the near to medium term from residential and commercial development, and a strong financial position that should remain stable supported by prudent fiscal practices and a proactive management team.

Standard and Poor's has also recently reaffirmed Addison's AAA rating.

Council Seeks Volunteers for Bond Committee

At the November 27 Council Meeting, the Council discussed the possibility of a 2019 bond program. As part of that program, Council also discussed forming a Bond Advisory Committee to help prioritize projects. The projects being considered impact our roads, parks, and municipal buildings. Both residents and members of the business community are encouraged to participate. If you are interested in being considered for this committee, please fill out this short form. We anticipate that the committee members will need to be available for one to two meetings per month from January through April. Council plans to consider appointments as early as the December 11 Council Meeting. Thank you for your willingness to serve.

Oktoberfest Recap



Addison Oktoberfest is one of four major special events the Town produces each year. The four-day festival focuses on promoting tourism for the Town and is recognized as one of the most authentic Oktoberfest celebrations outside of Germany.

This year, the event was held on September 20-23 at Addison Circle Park. An historic rain event caused severe flooding and unsafe conditions in the park, resulting in an early closure on September 21 and cancellation on September 22. These closures affected the overall attendance and revenue for the 2018 festival. At the November 27 Council Meeting, Special Events Director Jasmine Lee and Accounting Supervisor Ashley Boatright shared an event recap with Council. Judge Thaddeus Iwuji Resigns

Alternate Judge Thaddeus Iwuji was re-appointed as a Municipal Court Alternate Judge on October 23, 2018 for a term beginning on January 1, 2019. Mr. Iwuji was subsequently offered a full-time judge position with the City of Fort Worth. Mr. Iwuji notified the Town of his resignation on November 6, 2018, which was effective immediately.

Staff will recommend a process to Council for selecting a second alternate judge in January.

Public Safety

Addison Police Officers Recognized at Council Meeting





At the November 13 Council Meeting, Police Chief Paul Spencer presented several awards to Addison Police Officers for their outstanding efforts. Sergeant Coffelt and Officer Guemmer (not pictured) were presented with Life Saving Awards and Sergeant Helton, Officers Rivera, Rinehart, Aller, and Castaneda with Certificates of Merit for their quick actions on September 21, when officers responded to a shooting at a local hotel. The Addison Fire Department and hospital medical staff confirmed that APD's teamwork and quick response saved the life of the victim.



Officer Minwell was also awarded a Life Saving Award for his quick actions on August 24 when Addison officers responded to an attempted suicide at the DART Transit Center. Officer Minwell was the first person to arrive on the scene and his swift response is credited for saving the man's life.

Chief Spencer shared that the bravery, dedication, and professionalism of all of the award recipients are a testament to the character of all Addison's public safety professionals.
