# CFO Delivers 2017 Fourth Quarter Financial Report

CFO Olivia Riley shared the 2017 Fourth Quarter Financial Report with Council at the January 23 City Council Meeting. Some of the highlights included:

- Overall General Fund revenues finished up nearly 17.0% compared to FY2016
- Sales tax collections in the General Fund are up about 9.5% compared to FY2016
- Revenues for the Utility Fund are down 4.6% compared to compared to FY2016
- Occupancy Tax Revenues for the Hotel Fund are down about 4.0% compared to FY2016

#### **Council Gets Schooled in Debt 101**

Cities use debt to finance public infrastructure projects such as city facilities, parks, streets, water, and sewer and drainage improvements. Debt financing allows cities to finance projects, capital assets, or improvements to existing assets over their useful life. During a January 23 work session, the Town's financial advisor Nick Bulaich from Hilltop Securities gave a "Debt 101" presentation to Council. The presentation was intended to assist not only council members, but also citizens, businesses owners, and the general public in understanding the use of municipal debt. #### Ady Advantage/Gateway Planning Selected for ED Strategic Plan

As part of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 budget, Council approved \$100,000 for the development of an updated Economic Development Strategic Plan. The last Economic Development Strategic Plan was a five-year plan created in 2010 and the Town has achieved all of the goals in the original plan. At the January 23 City Council Meeting, Council approved a contract with Ady Advantage/Gateway Planning to develop a new strategic plan. The entire process is estimated to take six months. At the July 11, 2017 Council Meeting, the City Council adopted seven strategic pillars and nine priority milestones for Fiscal Year 2018. One of these pillars, Gold Standard in Public Safety, included a milestone to "maximize use of cutting-edge technology to enhance public safety."

Voters approved \$2 million in funds as part of the 2012 bond election for city-wide wireless applications to ensure high quality video, data, and voice applications for our first responders. During the January 23 City Council meeting, Police Chief Paul Spencer discussed with Council ways these funds could be used for technology that could assist public safety officials with investigations and help to deter crime.

Council asked staff to explore opportunities related to license plate readers and video cameras at the entrance/exit of neighborhoods including:

- Cost
- · Sophistication of equipment
- · Reallocation of resources, if necessary
- · Funding options from state/grants, if any
- · Comparison of technology used in other cities

Council also talked about options for improving lighting in neighborhoods. You can watch the discussion here.

Did you know you can sign up to receive monthly, weekly, or even daily crime alerts? Addison Police Department has partnered with LexisNexis' public crime map, <u>Community Crime Map</u>, to connect law enforcement with our community. Crime mapping helps the public get a better idea of the criminal activity in their area so they can make more informed decisions about how to stay safe.

#### **Have you Registered Your Alarm System?**

Beginning January 1, all residents and businesses who use their alarm system (even if it is not monitored), must register it at <a href="AddisonAlarmRegistration.com">AddisonAlarmRegistration.com</a>. There is no annual fee for residents (\$50 for businesses) and you will receive three free false alarm calls. However, if you do not register your system, you will be charged \$100 for the first false alarm. That fee will be waived if you register your system within 30 days.

**Town of Addison Receives Silver Fleet Award** 

The Town of Addison was recently awarded a Silver Fleet Award from the DFW Clean Cities Coalition for the third consecutive year. Three levels of awards - Gold, Silver, and Bronze - were possible, but there were no Gold awardees. Addison was one of only eight Silver Award honorees. The winners contributed to the region-wide reduction of more than 25 million gallons of gasoline in 2016, which represented the largest savings on record. Alternative fuel vehicles accounted for the vast majority of gallons (97 percent) and greenhouse gas emissions (75 percent) reduced.

Addison currently has 10 hybrid vehicles and will be introducing a fully electric vehicle to the fleet this year. The Council recognized General Services and Events Director Mark Acevedo and General Services and Events Assistant Director Rob Bourestom at the January 23 Council Meeting and thanked them for not only keeping our fleet on the road but also for taking steps toward cleaner and more efficient operations.
