Council Updates

Council Gives Direction on Issuance of Debt

During the November 13 City Council Meeting, City Manager Wes Pierson discussed the potential issuance of debt to fund the remainder of the Midway Road Reconstruction Project and the economic development incentive for the public infrastructure for the Addison Grove development. As explained in the <u>Debt 101</u> and <u>Debt 201</u> presentations previously shared with Council, cities use debt to finance public infrastructure projects such as city facilities, parks, streets, water, sewer, and drainage improvements. Debt financing allows cities to finance projects, capital assets, or improvements to existing assets over their useful life.

The current estimate for the Midway Road Reconstruction Project is \$41 million, which includes \$38 million for construction as presented in 2016 plus \$3 million to incorporate the Master Transportation Plan elements. There is \$16 million available from funds approved during the 2012 bond election, but that leaves a \$25 million gap. Council directed Mr. Pierson to proceed with the issuance of certificates of obligation for Midway Road based on the need of the project as identified by the design estimate to cover the remainder.

In 2016, the City Council approved a \$6.5 million economic development incentive agreement to reimburse the Addison Grove developer for the cost of the public infrastructure related to that project. The incentive was to be cash funded from multiple Town funding sources. The cash funding will impact the financial resources from those funding sources, particularly the General Fund, to deliver Town services. Three million dollars will already have been escrowed for the project by the end of Fiscal Year 2019. Council directed Mr. Pierson to proceed with the issuance of \$3.25 million in certificates of obligation to cover the balance of the Addison Grove economic development incentive.

Public hearings for both of these items will be held as the projects progress so residents will have the opportunity share their feedback on decisions that may impact the current tax rate.

Council Approves Contract to Replace Athletic Club HVAC

Council approved a \$1.18 million contract with Infinity Contractors International for the replacement of the Addison Athletic Club HVAC at the November 13 Council meeting. The project is expected to take approximately six months to complete. The Town bid this project in May 2018 and only received one bid that significantly exceeded the budget. Council opted to reject that bid and rebid the project this fall. The Town received four responses when the project was rebid and the low bid from Infinity Contractors was nearly \$400,000 less than the original bid that was rejected in May.

Council Discusses Addison Circle/ Cotton Belt Special Area Study Findings

Staff and the Town's consultants from Kimley-Horn and Associates presented the findings of the <u>Addison</u> <u>Circle/Cotton Belt Special Area Study</u> to Council at the August 14, 2018 meeting. At a work session on November 13, Kimley-Horn representatives gave an update to Council on questions asked since the August presentation. Council gave direction to the consultants on issues related to density, land uses, and character. The study will be updated with the new feedback and brought back to Council for further consideration at a future meeting.
