Council Amends Athletic Club Code of Ordinances

During the <u>January 23 Work Session</u>, staff shared with Council some proposed changes to the Addison Athletic Club (AAC) Code of Ordinances, which had not been updated since 2003. Some of the proposed changes included the following:

- Remove references to the Trinity Christian Athletic Complex
- Move AAC prohibited conduct to Member Policy
- · Define membership exceptions and ineligibility

At the February 13 City Council Meeting, Council approved the development plan for the Meridian Square sixth building at the corner of Airport Parkway and Spectrum Drive. 

APD Earns Third Texas Police Chief Association Reaccreditation

The Texas Police Chief Association (TCPA) Law Enforcement Recognition Program is a voluntary process where police agencies in Texas prove their compliance with 164 Texas Law Enforcement Best Practices. These Best Practices were carefully developed by Texas Law Enforcement professionals to assist agencies in their efficient and effective delivery of service, the reduction of risk, and the protection of an individual's rights.

Since its inception in 2006, over 50 Texas Law Enforcement Agencies have been recognized and many more are currently in the process to become recognized agencies. The Addison Police Department initially attained the TPCA accreditation in 2007 and 2017 marks its third re-accreditation. Council recognized the achievement during the February 13 City Council Meeting.

Dome Park Playground Equipment Arrives

The Dome Park playground equipment arrived this week and construction crews are working diligently to install it. Once complete, the playground will feature a tire swing, boulder outcroppings, slides, and rock scoopers. The playground manufacturer used GFRC (glass fiber reinforced concrete) to sculpt natural elements such as tree trunks and boulders as features within the playground. The manufacturer has also sculpted these elements into insects and animals such as a butterfly, caterpillar, and fossils. We challenge you to find all of the hidden creatures in this nature-themed playground once the playground is open! Construction is anticipated to be completed by mid-March.
