During 2017, 210 volunteers contributed more than 4,440 volunteer hours to the Addison community through the Addison Addvocates program. Corporate groups like National Life Group, Bank of America, Hilton Worldwide, and Hotel InterContinental were instrumental in sprucing up our parks, including Town Park and Addison Circle, but also in helping mulch the playground at George Bush Elementary. Residents and non-residents alike helped answer phones in municipal buildings during lunch, staff key positions during special events, and even patrol our community.

The Independent Sector, a coalition of nonprofits, foundations, and corporations, places the value of a volunteer hour at \$24.14. This means the value of our volunteers' time over the last year would be more than \$107,000!
