The evening of Thursday, March 22, Addison Fire Department (AFD) was dispatched to a structure fire at the Super 8 Motel at 4150 Beltway Drive. Over the course of the next several hours, a total of 26 fire units and 61 personnel responded to the threealarm blaze. The first crews who arrived at the scene quickly knocked on doors and made certain all the occupants were clear of the building. The fire, which appeared to begin on the second floor, spread quickly. Addison Participates in Mass Casualty Incident Drill with Metroplex Cities

Public safety officials from the Town of Addison and Cities of Carrollton, Coppell, and Farmers Branch conducted full-scale mass casualty exercises on March 20, 21, and 22.

The exercises simulated three separate events including a bus versus plane transportation accident at the Addison Airport, an active shooter at the Loos Athletic Complex, and a motor vehicle driven into a crowd at the R.E.Good Soccer Complex. These scenarios allowed responders to test agency capability in stabilizing incidents and caring for the injured at any events that exceed the normal capacity of a single department or jurisdiction.

The training involved more than 28 local organizations including representation from fire, police, EMS, hospitals, schools, transportation authorities, and community volunteers.

Belt Line Road Streetscape Public Input Workshop: Defining the Parameters Tuesday, April 3

The Parks Department is hosting a public input workshop on the Belt Line Road beautification project on Tuesday, April 3, at the Addison Athletic Club. This meeting will be the first of a series of input opportunities for the community on how to enhance the overall appearance of Belt Line Road from Marsh Lane to Midway Road. There will be two time slots in which the community is invited to attend: 5pm - 6pm and 7pm - 8pm. The Town will give an overview of the current Belt Line Road projects, define the objective of the Belt Line Road Streetscape project, and the consultant, Pachecho Koch, will define the

process for the project and begin to gather initial thoughts from the community. We encourage you to attend and have a voice in beautifying this important road within our Town.



DART will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on the alignment, grade separations, station locations, and facility locations for the Cotton Belt Corridor Regional Rail Project.
