Council Updates

Farmers Branch Creek Dispute Update

At the April 10 City Council Meeting, Council approved a motion directing outside Council and staff to pursue mediation with the City of Farmers Branch on the Farmers Branch Creek dispute. Addison City Manager Wes Pierson extended that offer to the Farmers Branch Council, who had it on their April 17 City Council meeting agenda to discuss in executive session. They did not take any action on the item, but have called a special meeting for April 23 to discuss it further.

Early Voting Starts Monday, April 23



Early voting for the May 5 election begins Monday, April 23, and will be held at Fire Station #1 at 4798 Airport Parkway on the following days/times:

Phase 8 of Vitruvian Development Underway



At the April 10 City Council Meeting, Council approved funds not to exceed \$2,349,453 for the construction of the public infrastructure for Phase 8 of Vitruvian. This phase of the project is located on the southeast corner of Marsh Lane and Spring Valley Road in the commercial development that Includes the Tom Thumb grocery store. The scope of work for the public infrastructure improvements for the project includes water, wastewater, storm drainage, paving, landscaping, irrigation, and streetscape improvements.

Council Amends 2017-18 Budget

Each year, Finance staff reviews the budget to determine which items should be recognized with formal budget amendments. When budget variances occur that are outside of the authority of the City Manager, these adjustments are presented to the council in the form of a budget amendment. At the April 10 Meeting, Council approved amendments to the General Fund, Hotel Fund, and Airport Capital Fund budgets. <u>Public Hearing</u>: Annual adoption of the standards of care for all youth programs at the Addison Athletic Club. The standards of care document provide minimum standards for operating youth programs such as the hiring of program staff, enrollment guidelines, discipline, health, and safety. It also addresses programming and providing activities that promote emotional, social, and mental growth. A public hearing is required by the Texas Human Resources Code.

Belt Line Road Overlay Project Update



The Belt Line Road Overlay milling portion of the project began on Sunday, April 15 and is moving quickly! All the existing asphalt will be removed so the Town can inspect the concrete subgrade. Concrete repairs will be made and the asphalt and pavement markings will then be replaced. TexasBit, the Town's contractor, anticipates the milling effort to take three weeks, depending on weather conditions and other factors. The entire project is slated to take four months to complete.
