Council Updates

Farmers Branch Council Declines Mediation Offer

At the April 10 City Council Meeting, Council approved a motion directing outside legal counsel and staff to pursue mediation with the City of Farmers Branch on the Farmers Branch Creek dispute. Addison City Manager Wes Pierson extended that offer to the Farmers Branch Council, who called a special meeting on April 23 to discuss it. Farmers Branch City Manager Charles Cox notified Addison on Tuesday, April 24 that Farmers Branch Council had declined Addison's offer. Addison remains committed to finding a reasonable solution to this issue.

Council Ratifies Wind Turbine Lawsuit Settlement

The Council ratified the wind turbine lawsuit settlement that was signed on April 11 at its April 24 City Council Meeting. You can watch the discussion here and read the agreement here. It is anticipated that the work to remove the wind turbines will take place as soon as removal equipment is available and weather permits. 
Council Appoints Irma Parker as New City Secretary

Council Approves Schematic Design for New U.S. Customs Facility at Addison Airport



In early January 2018, Council approved an agreement with Page Southerland Page, Inc. (Page) for architectural design services related to the design of a Customs and Border Protection Federal Inspection Services facility on Addison Airport. Council directed Page to consider design and associated costs for both a Customs facility with airport administrative offices and the Customs facility as a stand-alone building. Director of Infrastructure and Development Services Lisa Pyles shared those schematic designs and cost estimates with Council at the April 24 City Council Meeting.

Council selected the two-story Customs facility that includes airport offices on the second floor. The design not only provides a more efficient ability to collect Customs fees, but it also leaves room for development to the south of the new facility.

She also detailed two funding options: using Airport Fund balance or issuing certificates of obligation. Since the excess fund balance in the Airport Fund is not sufficient to cover the cost of the project, staff recommended issuing certificates of obligation (COs). The debt service on the COs will be funded through the operational dollars in the Airport Fund, which is a self-supporting enterprise fund that is not funded through taxes. As part of the process to issue COs, there will be several public notifications.

Addison To Move Forward on Sewer Line Repairs

On March 24, 2018, the Town of Addison received <u>notice</u> from the City of Farmers Branch that they would be canceling a long-standing sewer arrangement between the two cities due to a dispute related to Farmers Branch Creek. Addison has one unmetered sewer line that flows into Farmers Branch's system on the west side of town. Based on the terms of an agreement that dates back to the early 1990s, Addison compensates Farmers Branch for this arrangement.

Fortunately, Addison was already in the process of finding a solution to this issue. In order to meet Farmers Branch's two-month deadline, Addison has offered to install a temporary sewer meter to monitor the flow in the unmetered basin. This temporary solution has been accepted by Farmers Branch and will ensure no service disruptions for Addison businesses.

At the Council Meeting on April 24, Infrastructure and Development Services Director Lisa Pyles presented several options for a permanent solution. Council directed staff to move forward on a new gravity sewer collection line to re-route sewer flows away from the Farmers Branch system to an adjacent Addison basin already connected to Trinity River Authority meter station. The project is anticipated to be complete in the summer of 2019. You can watch the discussion here and read the presentation here.

The current equipment in the range was installed in 1983 and many of the components still in place are from the original system. Milling Completed on Belt Line Road Overlay Project Update



Addison's contractor TexasBit has completed the milling portion of the Belt Line Road Overlay project on time. Town staff will have concrete subgrade inspections completed by early next week so TexasBit can begin making any needed concrete repairs. After that is complete, TexasBit will begin to place new asphalt, which is slated to begin at the end of June. The project is currently on schedule and we anticipate completion in July.
