Council Updates

Council Authorizes City Manager to Settle Wind Turbine Lawsuit

At the February 27 City Council Meeting, Council authorized City Manager Wes Pierson to settle the wind turbine lawsuit. We are currently working to resolve a disagreement related to the details of the removal of the wind turbine system. We are endeavoring to ensure that the agreement is done right. We will share the final agreement as soon as it is complete.

Addison Responds to Farmers Branch Service Changes

Addison continues to explore options with surrounding communities to augment library services for Addison residents. Although the Tex Share program offers access to more than 500 libraries, including Farmers Branch, we understand there are a few limitations. Staff is also responding to requests for new classes for our seniors at the Addison Athletic Club by reaching out to teachers and evaluating ways to reconfigure the space to accommodate new programming.
