Addison City Council Canvasses May 5 Election

At a Special Council Meeting on May 15, the Addison City Council canvassed the results from the May 5 election. Paul Walden was reelected and Guillermo Quintanilla and Marlin Willesen were elected to replace Al Angell and Jim Duffy, who chose not to run. During the meeting, the Council selected Paul Walden as Mayor Pro Tempore and Tom Braun as Deputy Mayor Pro Tempore. Mayor Joe Chow also recognized Al Angell and Jim Duffy for their service to Addison over the past two years.

Public Hearings at May 22 City Council Meeting

PUBLIC HEARING Case 1775-Z/16803 Dallas Parkway. Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on property located at 16803 Dallas Parkway north of Excel Parkway, which is currently zoned Local Retail, to a Commercial-1 zoning district.

PUBLIC HEARING Case 1776-SUP/The Improv. Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on property located at 4980 Belt Line Road, Suite 250 and Suite 100A at the southwest corner of Belt Line Road and Quorum Drive, which is currently zoned Planned Development, by approving a new Special Use Permit for a restaurant with the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption only, in order to allow an expansion in floor area.



Next time you drive down Belt Line Road between Midway Road and Marsh Lane, take a minute to look up. Guess what is no longer there? UTILITY LINES! All of the utility lines have *finally* been placed underground. Once mobilized, Addison's contractor has 75 days to make the last remaining repairs to the sidewalks, curbs, and media landscaping before this phase of Belt Line Road construction is completed.

The next phase - the street overlay - is moving along on schedule. There are fewer concrete repairs than were anticipated, so we should, weather permitting, be able to finish this project by the end of July.
