Council Updates

Council Discusses Strategic Plan for Fiscal Year 2019

During a special council meeting on Monday, June 11, the City Council reviewed its strategic pillars and milestones for Fiscal Year 2018. The Council reaffirmed its strategic pillars and identified ten milestones for Fiscal Year 2019. The pillars and milestones will drive not only budgetary decisions, but also set the priorities for staff in the coming year.

Gary Slagel Reappointed as Addison's DART Representative

The cities of University Park and Richardson and the towns of Highland Park and Addison share a representative on the Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) Board of Directors. Gary Slagel is currently serving in this role and his term is set to expire on June 30, 2018. Robert Catalani was appointed by Deputy Mayor Pro Tempore Tom Braun at the June 12 Council Meeting to fulfill the unexpired Planning and Zoning Commission term of Denise Quintanilla. Ms.Quintanilla was appointed to the Planning and Zoning Commission by Deputy Mayor Pro Tempore Tom Braun on November 14, 2017 for a two-year term beginning on January 1, 2018. Council Takes Action to Modify Agreement with Addison Legacy Foundation

At the June 12 City Council meeting, the Council voted to modify the existing agreement between the Town of Addison, the Addison Legacy Foundation, and Communities Foundation of Texas (CFT) by removing the Town as a party to the agreement. The Addison Legacy Foundation was established on June 28, 2012 to provide a way for individuals, families, and organizations to make tax-deductible contributions to benefit Addison. The Council approved the Addison Legacy Foundation as a fund of the CFT which is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.

The "A-Team" Takes First Place at the Big D BBQ Battle


