Council Updates

Super 8 Demolition Update

On March 22, a fire caused extensive damage to the Super 8 Motel located at 4150 Beltway Drive. The Town provided the property owner a reasonable amount of time to work through insurance claims before issuing a notice of violation the beginning of August, in accordance with the International Property Maintenance Code. The notice of violation gives the property owner 30 days to commence demolition of the structure and 90 days, barring unusual circumstances, to complete the demolition.

The 30-day window has expired and since demolition has not yet begun, the City Council authorized the city attorney to file a lawsuit on behalf of the Town against the hotel owner, pursue an order to demolish the partially burned property, and recover all necessary costs and fees at the September 4 meeting. Council also authorized the city manager to expend necessary funds and take necessary action for the demolition of the property as approved by the court. The city attorney started the legal proceedings this week and we should have a hearing within a few weeks to receive the Court's order on our request to demolish the property.

Public Hearings on September 11

SECOND PUBLIC HEARING: Fiscal Year 2019 Budget. The proposed FY2019 operating budget requests an appropriation of \$94 million and \$26 million for the Capital Improvement Projects budget. The second public hearing on the budget will be held before the budget is adopted on September 11.

PUBLIC HEARING Case 1782-Z/Western International Offices. Public hearing on a recommendation

regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on the vacant parcel, generally located at 15275 Quorum Drive, on the southeast corner of Edwin Lewis Drive and Quorum Drive, which is currently zoned Planned Development (PD) through Ordinance No. O18-013, to a new PD in order to allow the development of a two-story single-tenant office building with surface parking.

PUBLIC HEARING <u>Case 1783-Z/Addison Office Condos</u>. Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on 1.446 acres generally located at 16360-16400 Addison Road, which properties are currently zoned Commercial-1 (C-1), to a PD zoning district, allowing shared parking across property lines.
