

Council Update

Get Information on the November 5 Bond Election



The Town has created a website (www.AddisonBond2019.com), video and woters (www.AddisonBond2019.com), video and woters (www.AddisonBond2019.com), video and woters Bond Election.

Monday, October 7 is the last day to register to vote in the November election and you can register at the <u>Dallas County Elections website</u>. Early voting begins October 21 and runs through November 1. Addison residents can early vote at any Dallas County polling place, including Fire Station One (4798 Airport Parkway) or at Fire Station Two (3950 Beltway Drive) on election day.

Council Discusses New Dallas County Vote Centers

At its September 24 work session, Council discussed the new vote centers that will be implemented by Dallas County for future elections. The Town of Addison partners with Dallas County to conduct its elections. Changes in the law, as well as changes being made by Dallas County, will likely impact the future voting locations for Town elections.

For the next two years, Addison voters will vote at Fire Station One (4798 Airport Parkway) or Fire Station Two (3950 Beltway Drive) on election day. You will still be able to early vote at Fire Station One or any Dallas County polling location.


