Council Updates

Interested in Running for Council? Only One Week Left to File

There is only one week left to file for the May 4 City Council election. Packets are available in the City Secretary's office at Town Hall, 5300 Belt Line Road, Monday through Friday from 8am - 5pm. Filing closes on Friday, February 15 at 5pm.

Council Rejects Construction Bids for Airport Customs Facility

On December 11 2018, Council approved the issuance of \$7 million in Certificates of Obligation for the construction of new Customs and Airport offices at 4545 Jimmy Doolittle Drive on Addison Airport. The bid for the construction of the two-story building that will also house the Airport Administration offices was posted on December 3, 2018 and closed on January 10, 2019. Even though 27 contractors attended the pre-bid meeting, the Town only received three bids.

One of the bidders was disqualified because their pricing proposal was incomplete. The bids from the remaining qualified bidders far exceeded the architect's cost estimate for the items that were included in this bid. At the February 7 Council Meeting, the Town rejected those bids and will rebid the project later this month.

Staff has contacted several contractors who did not bid and they shared that the timing of the bid, which fell during the holidays, prevented them for participating.

Economic Development Hosts Broker Breakfast

Addison Firefighters Participate in Fitness Pilot Study

Last fall, Addison-based REACT Neuro-Rehab invited the Addison Fire Department to participate in a pilot study designed to increase fitness and on-the-job readiness while preventing injuries. Two days a week, firefighters head over to the REACT gym on Beltway Drive after their shift ends to participate in a training program specially designed for them.

REACT is an adaptive fitness and recovery center where certified strength coaches, therapists, and researchers work together to apply advances in neuroscience and strength training. Many of the center's members suffer from spinal cord injuries, brain injuries, or other neurological impairments.

Tactical Strength and Conditioning Facilitator Ryan Bachik has applied the principles his team uses to train the nervous system in his spinal cord patients to train first responders. The ultimate goal of the project is to create a tactical conditioning program that can be replicated in police and fire departments across the country.
