

Council Adopts Belt Line 1.5 Beautification Master Plan



On October 23, 2018, Pachecho Koch presented a draft of the Belt Line 1.5 Beautification Master Plan to the City Council. The Consultant made the modifications requested by Council and presented the revised draft plan for public input at the Town meeting on October 29, 2018.

Staff began meeting with property owners along the Belt Line Road corridor in December 2018 and received favorable feedback about the plan. During its February 20 meeting, the City Council held a public hearing and adopted the Belt Line 1.5 Beautification Master Plan. Following the adoption of the plan, Director of Parks and Recreation Janna Tidwell presented the pricing and scope for the implementation of the project. Council gave staff direction to include all six bus shelter areas specified for the project as part of Phase 1. Sunny Street to be First Tenant in Marsh Lane Renovated Retail Space



Following a public hearing, Council approved a special use permit for Sunny Street Café at the Council Meeting on February 20. The popular breakfast restaurant will be the first tenant in the newly renovated Brookhaven Village Shopping Center on Marsh Lane. The café will operate seven days a week from 6:30am–2:30pm, offering breakfast and lunch all day.

Finance Staff Delivers First Quarter Financial Report for the FY 2019

The Town of Addison's financial policies require the publication of a financial report 60 days subsequent to the end of each fiscal quarter. On February 20, Budget Manager Terri Doby delivered the <u>Town's financial report for the first quarter for Fiscal Year (FY) 2019</u> (October 1, 2018 - December 31, 2018). Some of the k ey highlights for the first quarter include:

- Fiscal year-to-date General Fund revenue totaled almost \$9.9 million, which is 26 percent of the overall budget amount. Sales tax collections are 26.3 percent of the fiscal year 2019 budget. General Fund expenditures for the various departments are in line with budget.
- Sales tax is up 7% in the first quarter.
- Hotel occupancy tax collections are 16.7 percent of budget for two months of collections or 16.6 percent of the fiscal year. Performing Arts expenditures are at 66.3% due to the first payment of the WaterTower Theatre grant, and Special Events expenses are at 18.8% due to timing of events.
- Utility Fund operating revenue through the first quarter totaled just over \$2 million or 15.9 percent of the fiscal year 2019 budget. Water revenues are 14.7 percent of the fiscal year 2019 budget, the result of unusually wet weather. With a one-month lag in the collection of utility revenues, 16.7 percent of the fiscal year has expired. Utility Fund operating expenses through the first quarter totaled approximately \$2.6 million, or 22 percent of the fiscal year 2019 budget. Wastewater treatment expenses, however, are unusually high due to the timing of payments and increased costs from the Trinity River Authority wastewater treatment.
- Stormwater Fund operating revenue through the first quarter totaled almost \$430 thousand or 19.9% of the fiscal year 2019 budget. With a one-month lag in the collection of stormwater revenues, 16.7 percent of the fiscal year has expired. Stormwater Fund operating expenses through the first quarter totaled approximately \$207 thousand or 10.3 percent of the fiscal year 2019 budget.

The financial condition of the Town remains strong and all reported funds adhere to the 25% fund balance requirement.

CFO Olivia Riley also shared the Town's <u>First Quarter Investment Report</u>. Investments adhere to state law and the Town's Investment Policy as adopted by Council.

Work Progresses on Addison Circle Fountain



In October 2018, Addison City Council approved a one million dollar contract with Gadberry Construction to make Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements to the Addison Circle Park plaza and modernize the fountains. The contractor has installed the new surge tank, poured the concrete wall that will separate the plaza fountain and lower basin, and prepared mock-ups of the wall / paving finishes. They are in the process of forming the concrete steps and will begin fine grading of the plaza and installing the piping for the fountain later this month.

The project is on schedule to be substantially complete by May 15 when our special events season kicks off!

Sherlock Drainage Project Update

FNH Contractors, the Town's contractor for the Sherlock Drainage Project, is currently working in the intersection of Sherlock Drive and Winter Park Lane. They are installing stormwater pipe and several new inlets. Once complete, they will begin the process of removing the pavement within the intersection, regrading, and then replacing the concrete. They are also beginning the restoration process in the area along the trail that was disturbed by the construction between Beltway Drive and Belt Line Road.

The contractor is currently slightly behind schedule due to weather and previously unknown utility conflicts. We continue to work with them to expedite the project and we anticipate work will be complete by the beginning of May. Thank you for your patience as we work to improve our community.
