Council Updates

Council Gets Update on Midway Road Construction Project

At the March 26 City Council Meeting, Assistant Director of Infrastructure and Engineering Services Jason Shroyer provided Council an update on the Midway Road reconstruction project design including the project scope and cost estimates, as well as the project schedule, communications plan, and anticipated land acquisition activities.

In 2012, Addison voters approved \$16,000,000 in General Obligation bonds for the reconstruction of Midway Road from Spring Valley Road to Trinity Mills Road. In November 2018, Council directed the City Manager to proceed with the issuance of Certificates of Obligation in the amount of \$25 million to completely fund the project. The 2012 bond program did not include the replacement of the utilities under the roadway or the increase in scope to accommodate the new Master Transportation Plan elements that are included as part of the current plan.

The project is now 90% designed and construction on the three-year project is estimated to begin in early 2020.

Additionally, in anticipation of the need to acquire right-of-way for the project, Council a uthorized City Manager Wes Pierson to execute the necessary easement and property acquisition agreements.

Council Approves Pilot Program for Bike and Scooter Sharing

At its March 26 meeting, Council approved a Pilot Program that will pave the way for companies like Lime and Bird to operate in Addison. Council will evaluate the new Personal Transportation Vehicle (PTV) permitting program this fall to determine if it should be continued or if additional regulations are required. The <u>approved ordinance</u> has a sunset clause and will expire on December 31, 2019 if Council does not take action to renew or amend it.

Any company offering PTVs for rental in the public right-of-way or other Town property will be required to obtain a permit agreement from the Town that will require them to agree to a number of requirements regarding the maintenance and upkeep of PTVs, the placement and parking of PTVs, as well as other operational requirements.

Interested in Serving on an Art and Design Committee for the New Addison DART Transit Center?

In December 2018, DART awarded a contract to Archer Western Herzog Joint Venture (AWH) for the design and construction of the Cotton Belt Regional Rail Project. While some station design elements will be consistent in each station, other features, such as a public art, will also be selected so that each station reflects its community.

DART has proposed using an Art and Design Committee to provide input on these unique design elements and has requested that the Town provide 8-14 individuals to make up Addison's Art and Design Committee. DART estimates the process will include five committee workshops over four months. These meetings are anticipated to start in July of 2019 and will take place in the evenings.


