Council Updates

Saturday, May 4 is Election Day

On Saturday, May 4, Addison residents will go to the polls to elect three council members and a mayor. On election day, voters must go to the polling place that corresponds to their Precinct Number. If you don't know your Precinct Number, you can look it up <u>here</u>. Polling Places will be open from 7am - 7pm.

- The following precincts will vote at Fire Station #1, 4798 Airport Parkway: 2902, 2903, 2904, and 2905
- The following precincts will vote at Fire Station #2, 3950 Beltway Drive: 2900 and 2901
- The following precinct will vote at Josey Ranch Lake Library, 1700 N. Keller Springs Road: 2403.

Results will be posted on the <u>Dallas County website</u>, on the Town's website at <u>www.AddisonTexas.net</u>, and at Fire Station 1.

Council Reviews Draft Special Events Strategic Plan

In September 2018, the Town contracted with Strategic Event Initiatives, Inc. to develop a strategic plan and make recommendations to enhance and expand Addison's special events. The goal of the plan is to attract more visitors and increase the economic impact

of the events that Addison produces, as well as those that it hosts. The consultant has completed an audit of Addison events and an evaluation of event competitors and Addison's third-party event process. Additionally, the consultants reviewed event venues taking into consideration planned infrastructure changes, and analyzed Addison's event and tourism marketing and the overall cohesion of the efforts by all tourism-related departments that support the Addison brand.

Council reviewed a draft of the Special Events Strategic Plan during its April 25 meeting. The plan will be brought back to Council at a future meeting for adoption.

Infrastructure and Development Services Shares 5-Year Street Maintenance Plan

In a continuing goal to implement the maintenance, repairs, and replacements that were included in the recently completed condition assessment for the Asset Management Plan, staff has developed the Infrastructure and Development Services Streets Division 5-Year Maintenance Plan for repair and maintenance of the Town's streets, sidewalks, curb ramps, and storm water inlets. Infrastructure and Development Services Director Lisa Pyles presented the plan to Council at its April 25 meeting.

In years 2020 to 2024, maintenance and repair activities are assumed based on an annual amount of \$230,000 in the Streets Division budget. The actual maintenance and repair activities will be dependent on the allocation of funds and any unforeseen and unanticipated repairs that may be needed. The planned activities in any given year may change if a bond election is held that includes reconstruction of streets that are listed in each year. The plan will then be updated each year to reflect those changes.

Council Approved Change Order for Midway Road Reconstruction Design Contract

At its April 25 Meeting, Council approved a \$185,000 change order for the design of the Midway Road Reconstruction Project. The majority of the changes are a result of adding Master Transportation Plan elements to the project, including:

- <u>Roadway Design</u>: The intersection of Midway and Belt Line Roads was originally excluded from the project, however the added pavement enhancements associated with the Master Transportation Plan necessitate reconstruction of the intersection.
- <u>Signing, Markings and Signalization</u>: This task includes the additional signing, pavement markings, temporary signal and permanent signal design efforts associated with the addition of the Midway Road and Belt Line Road intersection reconstruction. The inclusion of the signals at this intersection is needed to accommodate the new Master Transportation Plan elements.
- <u>Traffic Control and Sequencing</u>: This task includes the additional construction sequencing design effort associated with the reconstruction of the Midway Road and Belt Line Road intersection.

• <u>Easement and Right-of-Way Acquisition</u>: This task includes the appraisal cost to acquire up to twenty-six parcels for inclusion of the Master Transportation Plan elements, as well as any necessary support for eminent domain.

The items in the change order should not significantly impact the total project cost. You can watch the Council discussion on the Midway Road change order here.

Council Approved Finance Committee Second Quarter Update

The Finance Committee serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and includes: Deputy Mayor Pro-Tempore Tom Braun, Council Member Ivan Hughes, and Council Member Marlin Willesen. The group reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council regarding the following matters:

- Quarterly financial reports
- Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR)
- · Long-term debt capacity of the Town
- · Engagement of independent accounting firms to audit the financial statements
- Review the adequacy and implementation of an internal audit function

The Committee meets monthly and is required to provide quarterly reports to the Council. At its April 25 Meeting, Council approved the 2nd quarter of Fiscal Year 2019 report from January 2019 to March 2019.

Addison Arbor Foundation Presents Two Public Art Pieces for Council Consideration





At its April 25 meeting, Council approved the location of two new public art pieces that were presented by Addison Arbor Foundation.

The first, which is named "Chacoan," is a limestone, stacked sandstone, steel, and glass sculpture by New Mexico-based artist Greg Reiche. The sculpture, which is estimated to cost approximately \$25,000, will be placed in the plant trial garden at the eastern end of the Les Lacs Park parking lot. The Addison Arbor Foundation is using grant funds from Fiscal Year 2018 and 2019 for this project.

The second sculpture, a bronze and stainless steel sculpture featuring cast bronze ravens, is a collaboration between two Texas artists, Jim Eppler and Scott Shubin. This

piece will be located at the southwest corner of the AMLI Development on Quorum Drive adjacent to a DART bus shelter and was funded through a donation from AMLI.

Council Approves Large Mural at Vitruvian Park

Vitruvian West I is the first of three multi-family apartment buildings being constructed at the northeast corner of Marsh Lane and Vitruvian Way. The development's parking garage is almost entirely wrapped by the apartment units and is only visible at the entrance. A portion of the southern garage façade is exposed, faces Vitruvian Way, and is adjacent to the main leasing office.

At its April 25 meeting, Council approved a meritorious exception to Addison's sign ordinance that will allow the property owner to paint a 57 foot tall by 39 foot wide mural on the exposed side of garage. The public art piece, which depicts certain elements of life in the Vitruvian Park neighborhood, will only be visible from Vitruvian Way.


