Council Update

Upcoming Public Hearings

The following public hearings will take place at the July 9 City Council Meeting, 5300 Belt Line Road. The meeting begins at 7:30pm and <u>the agenda will be posted here</u> three days prior.

<u>Certificates of Obligation Issuance</u>. Public hearing on a resolution relating to giving notice of Intention to issue Town of Addison combination tax and revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2019.

- On November 13, 2018, the City Council discussed issuing Certificates of Obligation to fund the estimated \$41 million reconstruction of Midway Road. In 2012 voters approved \$16 million in funding for this reconstruction project. \$3 million is being spent on the design of the project, \$13 million is available for construction. However, the total project estimate is \$41 million so there is a funding gap of approximately \$25 million. The Town will be issuing \$15,000,000 in Certificates of Obligations for the purpose of reconstruction of Midway Road. The issuance of additional Certificates of Obligations will be pursued to pay for the reconstruction project as they are needed.
- The Council approved Master Facilities Agreement that governs the commitments between the Town of Addison and UDR for the redevelopment of the area generally known as Vitruvian identified the issuance of Certificates of Obligation as one of the funding sources for the Town's obligation to provide public infrastructure. In

accordance with the Master Facilities Agreement, the Town will be issuing \$3,000,000 in Certificates of Obligations for the purpose of funding streetscape, road, and well-site improvements associated with the development.

<u>Case 1801-Z/Holiday Inn.</u> Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on property located at 4355 Beltway Drive, which is currently zoned Planned Development (PD) through Ordinance O95-007, by amending the permitted uses to allow for the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption only upon approval of a Special Use Permit, and by approving such Special Use Permit.




Kids and Cops

Plane Crashes into Hangar at Addison Airport

On Sunday, June 30 at approximately 9:10am, a Beechcraft BE-350 King Air crashed into a hangar at Addison Airport shortly after take off killing all 10 passengers on board. The first Addison Fire Department units were on scene in 1.5 minutes and were able to extinguish the resulting blaze in less than 20 minutes. With help from the City of Farmers Branch Emergency Management team, a Family Assistance Center was set up at the Addison Conference Centre. Family members of the victims gathered there Sunday afternoon and Monday for updates from the Medical Examiner's office, briefings from the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) investigators, and assistance from local support groups, including the American Red Cross and Dallas County Health and Human Services.

NTSB investigators were able to recover the aircraft's cockpit voice recorder and shared at a press briefing on Tuesday that on the recording, the pilots indicated a problem with the left engine. The NTSB has transported the plane to an undisclosed, secure site and will continue their investigation there. They anticipate releasing a preliminary report in two weeks, but the entire investigation could last up to two years.

Remember the 4 D's of Mosquito Avoidance and Protection



Beginning in May of each year, the Town deploys mosquito traps on the east and west sides of town. These are collected weekly and sent to the Dallas County Health and Human Services labs for testing. The traps are designed only to capture the types of mosquitoes that carry the West Nile Virus.

When the Town receives a positive test result, Staff will respond by spraying the area the following two mornings. Staff will post signs before spraying and a notice will be placed on the <u>Town's website</u> as well as Nextdoor. Please make sure you are registered to receive mosquito notifications on <u>Addison Alert</u> if you would also like to receive text messages.

In the last month, we've had two positive tests for West Nile Virus on the east side of Town. We strongly encourage all residents to employ the 4 D's of mosquito avoidance and protection:

Dress: Wear long, loose fitting, light-colored clothing when outdoors

DEET: Use insect repellent products containing "DEET" following the product label for application

Drain:

- · Eliminate ALL standing water
- Remove, cover or invert any containers that can collect and hold standing water (bottles, cans, buckets, flower pots, tires, trash containers, etc.)
- Change water in pet dishes, bird baths, wading pools, etc.
- Remove litter, leaves, grass clippings, etc. from roof gutters/downspouts and French drain systems so water will properly drain

Dusk & Dawn: Stay indoors during dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active
