Police Records Office Has New Hours

Effective January 27, the Police Records Office will be launching updated hours to better serve our citizens. The new hours will be 7am – 6pm, Monday through Thursday. The office will be closed to the public on Fridays. We hope these hours will allow you to stop by before or after work, school, or whatever you have going on!

Addison Police Department Partners with Ring

If you are one of the many Ring customers who uses this popular system to help secure your home, you are probably familiar with Ring's free Neighbors app that is designed to help community members connect and stay informed about what's going on around them.

What you may not know is that you can use the Neighbors app even if you do not own a Ring device.

Ring partners with law enforcement agencies throughout the country to help open the lines of communication between police and the communities they serve. This week, Ring announced they have added the Addison Police Department (APD) to its growing list of partners.

Through clearly identified posts denoting their role, APD officers can view and comment on public Neighbors app posts within their jurisdiction to connect with and help members of the community. Users also have the option to provide helpful information if APD asks for assistance with an investigation. They can choose whether to share videos, or opt out of future requests. The process has been designed to ensure that no user information is shared with police unless the user chooses to do so, including whether or not they received the request.

Police are never given access to users' cameras or devices through the Neighbors app or Ring. The police department's Neighbors app portal does not provide them with the addresses at which any devices are located without a user's express consent. Users are identified in the Neighbors app post/comments only as "Neighbor #." Police see the same information on their Neighbors app portal as regular users and do not receive additional information about the post or the user posting or commenting.

Please be aware that APD will not be continuously monitoring the comments and posts on the Neighbors app. Residents should always call 911 if they see something suspicious in their neighborhood.

APD is pleased to have yet another tool to aid them in preventing and solving crimes in our community. You can <u>read more about the Neighbors App by Ring here</u>.

- Construction



DART Approves Funding for Belt Line Road 1.5 Beautification Project



The Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) Board of Directors approved interlocal agreements to fund street repair projects for four service area cities at their Tuesday, January 14 meeting, including one in Addison.

Board members voted unanimously to fund \$441,519 to assist with street repair improvements on Belt Line Road between Marsh Lane and Midway Road, including completing sidewalk gaps and adding additional bus shelters at select DART stops along the corridor. When complete, all bus stops will include seating, accessible paving, and trash receptacles.


DART's Street Repair Policy was approved in 1994 to assist service area cities with needed repairs. That policy was amended in 1997 to develop a street repair process to select projects for consideration based on budgets and DART's Twenty-Year Financial Plan.
