COVID-19 Update

On October 22, Dallas County Health and Human Services (DCHHS) reported 434 additional positive cases of COVID-19 for a cumulative total of 91,6641 confirmed cases, including 1,093 confirmed deaths. To date, Addison has a total of 388 confirmed COVID-19 cases and no deaths according to DCHHS. DCHHS releases new numbers every Tuesday and Friday and reports can be found on their website here.

As a reminder, the <u>Executive Order</u> issued by Governor Greg Abbott on July 2 requiring all Texans to wear a face covering over the nose and mouth in public spaces remains in effect. Please continue to also follow these preventative measures to help reduce the spread of COVID-19:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).

Council Approves Third Change Order for Customs Facility at Addison Airport

On August 27, 2019, the Addison City Council approved a contract with JC Commercial, Inc. for the construction of the U.S Customs and Border Protection and Airport Administration facility at Addison Airport in the amount of \$6,223,949. At its October 13 meeting, Council approved a third project change order in the amount of \$17,275.41 for drywall revisions, landscape and irrigation changes, and an allowance for equipment rental extensions, among other items.

The three change orders have increased the project cost to \$6,405,347.67, which is still within the budget for the project, and extended the contract completion date to February 13, 2021.

Council Approves Services Agreement with World Affairs Council

At its October 13 meeting, the City Council approved a \$60,000 contract with the World Affairs Council of Dallas/Fort Worth (WAC) for the following services:

- International Promotion and Business Development
- Entrepreneur Development
- Provide Addison with opportunities to participate in international events
- Feature Addison as a Strategic Partner
- Consulting Services

Over the last few years, the Town of Addison has maintained a formal agreement with WAC. Under earlier agreements, WAC provided support to the Town to enhance its efforts with World Fest. In Fiscal Year 2015, the focus of WAC's efforts evolved to provide support in enhancing the Town's international business development efforts. Mayor Joe Chow, Mayor Pro Tempore Lori Ward, and Council Member Ivan Hughes serve as the Council Liaisons to WAC. The total annual funding amount was approved in the FY 2021 Budget as part of the Economic Development & Tourism Department annual budget paid out of the Hotel Fund.

Addison Adds Recycling Container Option





Addison is now providing another option for recycling container size! Residents can choose between the current 65-gallon recycle cart OR an 18-gallon recycle bin. Container swaps and deliveries will be made on November 9.

The North Texas Tollway Authority has notified the Town that the Addison Airport Toll Tunnel will be closed from 9pm Sunday, October 25 - 5am Monday, October 26 for regularly scheduled maintenance. Please seek alternate routes.

Early Voting Runs Through October 30



Early voting began October 13 and for the first time, Loos Field House at 3815 Spring Valley Road will be used as a vote center. Addison voters may vote there or at any Dallas County early voting location. <u>Find a complete list here</u>, along with wait times for each location.
