Council Update

Town of Addison COVID-19 Update



Dallas County issued a <u>revised Stay-at-Home order</u> on April 23 that extends the original order until May 15 and aligns language for <u>elective surgeries</u>, "reopened services," and religious and worship services with <u>Governor Abbott's recent orders</u>. Governor Abbott is expected to announce additional phased openings on Monday, April 27.

Retail-to-go for non-essential retailers began today, April 24. Customers are not allowed in stores and should make payments over the phone or online. Purchased items should be delivered to the customer's trunk or backseat to minimize contact. Get more details about what is expected from customers and employees here.

LPA Presents Findings of the Facility Utilization Study

In July of 2019, LPA Dallas was engaged to help the Town conduct a facility usage study. The start of a process to review Addison's existing facilities with an eye towards the future, this study looked at eight facilities that could be considered for modifications. The process involved extensive interviews with staff on how they currently use the facilities, what departments they interact with, and what they see as future needs for their departments. Additionally, LPA conducted an in-depth review of the selected facilities to create and scale floor plans.

LPA collected and analyzed the data and was asked to broadly develop some concepts to present for discussion. The goal is to begin a data-driven discussion to find a solution that will provide improved functionality for staff and the public, accommodate future growth, and address the facility deficiencies that currently exist with buildings in excess of 30 years old. While there are currently no plans to build new facilities unless an exceptional opportunity related to future new development opportunities presented itself, this process begins to lay the groundwork needed for future decisions.

At the April 14 Council Meeting, LPA presented the findings of the study including three concepts for the Council to consider: Renovate in Place, Strategic Additions, and New Construction. While the Council agreed the project was important, given the current situation, it is not urgent. They directed staff to begin a financial and economic assessment of the facilities to make a more informed determination about next steps.

April 28 City Council Meeting To Be Virtual

The city was able to forego the requirement that public meetings be held in a physical space because of a recent order from Governor Greg Abbott that suspended a portion of the Texas Open Meetings Act.

Opportunities for public comment will still take place at the beginning of meeting. Members of the public who would like to participate remotely can:

Once in the meeting, visitors will be recognized by Council during the public comment time. Please remember that normal rules for public comment apply so please state your name and address before beginning your comments. You will be allowed three minutes to speak and Council isn't permitted to respond during this time.

Please note that if you are viewing a meeting via a live streaming process, there will be a delay in the video since video takes time to transmit over the Internet to your device.


COVID-19 Business Resources

Celebrating National Volunteer Week





Follow CDC Social Distancing Guidelines

The Town of Addison is taking action to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We would like to encourage everyone to join us. The CDC has encouraged the community to practice social distancing, but also to follow these steps to minimize the spread of any disease:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).
