Council Update

[COVID-19 Update](#)



This week Dallas County reported three straight days with fewer than 1,000 COVID-19 cases after 18 consecutive days with more than 1,000. As a reminder, the [Executive Order](#) issued by Governor Greg Abbott on July 2 requiring all Texans to wear a face covering over the nose and mouth in public spaces remains in effect. Please continue to also follow these preventative measures to help reduce the spread of COVID-19:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).

As of July 21, Addison had a total of 157 confirmed COVID-19 cases and no deaths according to Dallas County Health and Human Services (DCHHS). DCHHS releases new numbers every Tuesday and Friday and [reports can be found on their website here](#) .

No Council Meeting on July 28

In order to give staff time to focus on the preparation of the Fiscal Year 2021 budget, Council has canceled the July 28 City Council Meeting. Per Addison's Charter, the City Manager must present his proposed budget to Council by midnight on July 31. A full list of [important budget dates is available here](#).

Council Discusses Updates to the Town's Naming and Recognition and Public Art Policies

At its July 14 meeting, the City Council discussed staff's proposed changes to the Town's Naming and Recognition and Public Art Policies. The Naming and Recognition Policy addresses the naming or renaming of structures, parks, trails, and other Town-owned facilities. The current policy gives guidelines for the naming of a facility to recognize a contribution. However, staff requested more direction regarding the following points:

- Clarity regarding acceptance and recognition of small donations made that are not associated with the naming of a facility;
- Alignment with or support for current fundraising methods implemented by non-profits to solicit funds on behalf of the Town;
- Recognizing an individual or significant services; and
- Detail in defining the process for naming and renaming facilities.

Staff also shared possible changes to the current Public Art Policy to reflect what is currently being done to recognize donations made to non-profits like the Addison Arbor Foundation.

Business Pulse

Deadline to Apply for Addison CARES Lease/Mortgage Assistance Grant Program is July 31



The Town of Addison has established a Lease/Mortgage fund in the amount of \$500,000 to provide grant assistance to local small businesses who have been financially distressed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Each award grant is valued at 75% of a business' gross lease or mortgage for two months, for a maximum grant award of up to \$10,000 per company.

The goal of the program is to improve the sustainability and longevity of the most vulnerable companies who maintain operations in Addison. The program offers relief to Addison businesses who have not had an opportunity to receive funding through other COVID - 19 relief programs such as the Payment Protection Program, SBA Loans or other funding sources intended to curb the financial impact of the pandemic.

Around Addison

Moody's and S&P Reaffirm Addison's Top Ratings

Moody's and Standard and Poor's (S&P) credit rating agencies have both reaffirmed Addison's highest possible bond rating status. In November 2018, Moody's upgraded Addison's rating to Aaa, but Addison has maintained a AAA from S&P since 2008.

[In a recent press release](#), Moody's shared that its Aaa rating reflects Addison's moderately-sized tax base and solid financial operations, reserves boosted by additional and available liquidity outside the main operating fund, and an adept management team that uses conservative practices to guide budget planning and execution.

[S&P's report](#) highlighted strong management, with strong financial policies and practices under its Financial Management Assessment methodology, and a very strong liquidity position.

Addison is one of only 11 cities in Texas that have a top rating by both credit rating agencies.

Remember the 4 D's of Mosquito Avoidance and Protection



Beginning in May of each year, the Town deploys mosquito traps on the east and west sides of town. These are collected weekly and sent to the Dallas County Health and Human Services labs for testing. The traps are designed only to capture the types of mosquitoes that carry the West Nile Virus.

When the Town receives a positive test result, Staff will respond by spraying the area the following two mornings. Staff will post signs before spraying and a notice will be placed on the [Town's website](#) as well as shared on Nextdoor. Please make sure you are registered to receive mosquito notifications on [Addison Alert](#) if you would also like to receive text messages.

Addison had its first positive test for West Nile Virus on the west side of Town this week. We strongly encourage all residents to employ the 4 D's of mosquito avoidance and protection:

Dress: Wear long, loose fitting, light-colored clothing when outdoors.

DEET: Use insect repellent products containing "DEET" following the product label for application.

Drain: Eliminate ALL standing water Remove, cover or invert any containers that can collect and hold standing water (bottles, cans, buckets, flower pots, tires, trash containers, etc.) Change water in pet dishes, bird baths, wading pools, etc. Remove litter, leaves, grass clippings, etc. from roof gutters/downspouts and French drain systems so water will properly drain.

Dusk & Dawn: Stay indoors during dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active.

Oncor Tower Replacement Project Ahead of Schedule

Oncor began their tower replacement project within the Redding Trail corridor the week of July 13 and the trail will be closed for use during construction. [This map](#) shows alternative trail and sidewalk routes that can be used. Oncor is currently slightly ahead of schedule and will be installing the temporary fence in the Redding Trail Dog Park the week of July 27, a week earlier than planned. The dog park will be closed for this work. Please see the revised schedule below.

July 27 – August 8 : Access Work

- The Redding Trail Dog Park will be closed to allow Oncor to install temporary fencing. Once the fencing is installed half of the dog park will be open for use.
- Oncor will perform ROW access work.
- The trail will be closed during daytime work hours and will be open during the evening hours.

August 10 – October 30 : Install foundations & Line Construction

- A reduced portion of the Redding Trail Dog Park will open for use. Periodic closures for construction may be required.
- The trail will be closed to the public.

November 1 – 30: Clean-up & Restoration

- Oncor will clean-up and repair damage to the landscape
- Addison parks crews will install the pedestrian light poles and replacement vegetation.

Staff is working closely with Oncor on a daily basis to ensure that the removal of trees and vegetation is being carried out as planned. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Janna Tidwell at jtidwell@addisontx.gov.
