Council Update

COVID-19 Update



On Wednesday, September 1, Dallas County lowered its COVID Risk Level from red, "Stay Home Stay Safe" to orange, "Extreme Caution" for the first time since May. This decision follows a decrease in hospital and ICU admissions over the past two weeks. People over 65 or in a high-risk group should still avoid in-person activities.

Dallas County Health and Human Services Director Dr. Philip Huang also said people should continue to observe the precautions that have helped lower the infection rate in the county and that lowering the risk level wasn't a cue to relax precautions. To date, Addison has had a total of 292 confirmed COVID-19 cases and no deaths according to Dallas County Health and Human Services (DCHHS). DCHHS releases new numbers every Tuesday and Friday and [reports can be found on their website here](#).

As a reminder, the [Executive Order](#) issued by Governor Greg Abbott on July 2 requiring all Texans to wear a face covering over the nose and mouth in public spaces remains in effect. Please continue to also follow these preventative measures to help reduce the spread of COVID-19:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).

Council Holds First Public Hearing on Tax Rate and Budget

At a Special Meeting on Tuesday, September 1, the City Council held the first of two public hearings on the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 tax rate and budget. At the August Budget Work Sessions, Council gave direction to staff to use a tax rate for FY 2021 of \$0.616878 per \$100 of valuation, which was slightly higher than the tax rate proposed in the [City Manager's proposed budget](#). The rate of \$0.616878 per \$100 of valuation is higher than last year's adopted rate of \$0.583500 per \$100 of valuation, but does not exceed the no-new-revenue tax rate, which is the tax rate that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for the Town from the same properties in both the 2019 tax year and the 2020 tax year. A calculation of Addison's no-new-revenue tax rate, voter-approval tax rate, and de minimus rate was published in the *Dallas Morning News* on August 29, 2020, but is also available on the [Town's website here](#).

Due to an increase in the number of property tax value protests and operational disruptions related to the COVID-19 pandemic, Dallas County Appraisal District (DCAD) was unable to provide a final certified tax roll before the City Manager was required to submit his budget to Council on July 31. DCAD instead provided the Town with a certified estimate, which was far below actual anticipated values so the Town used an internal estimate of values to calculate the proposed tax rate. Addison received the certified tax values from DCAD on August 20 and they totaled \$4,925,943,024, which is just over \$62 million more than the Town's internal estimate.

In addition, since the proposed budget was submitted to Council, the Town also learned that health care insurance rates will not increase next year. The proposed budget anticipated a 5% increase.

Based on the new information regarding health care costs and the fact that taxable values were higher than estimated, Council discussed and directed staff to lower the tax rate from \$0.616878 per \$100 of assessed value to \$0.608676 per \$100 of assessed value at the September 1 meeting.

The average taxable home value in Addison is \$335,597, which would generate a tax bill of \$2,043 at a tax rate of \$0.608676 per \$100 of assessed value. Last year, the average taxable home value was \$329,891 which generated a tax bill of \$1,925. The average taxpayer would pay about \$118 more in property taxes than last year at the rate discussed by Council at the September 1 meeting. Individual taxes may increase or decrease depending on the change in the taxable value of your property.

A property owner's total property tax bill is impacted by the tax rates and exemptions adopted by other taxing entities such as the Dallas County, the Dallas Independent School District, the Dallas County Community College District, and Parkland Hospital. Taxes paid by Addison homeowners to the city equal approximately 24% of their total tax bill.

Council Approves Agreement with the Texas Coalition for Affordable Power for Wholesale Energy and Service Agreement with GEXA Energy

In 2002, the State's electric deregulation legislation authorized the creation of electric aggregation groups to consolidate city electric procurements and thereby negotiate beneficial pricing. The Texas Coalition for Affordable Power (TCAP) now aggregates the electric needs of 165 members, including the Town of Addison.

In previous TCAP contracts, the aggregation group signed contracts for up to five years with one generator. The challenge was always when to lock-in for the next contract term. Electric costs are directly tied to present and future natural gas costs in the commodities futures markets. A weather event like a hurricane in the Gulf of Mexico or international tensions in the Middle East can affect oil and natural gas prices and make finalizing an electric deal at the wrong time significantly more expensive.

With the hope of reducing future electric costs, TCAP studied past natural gas cost trends to explore ways to take advantage of trends in the natural gas futures market. This led to a new contracting proposal that TCAP termed its "Strategic Hedging Program" (SHP). The goal of the SHP is to look ahead for advantageous future natural gas costs and over time award shorter-term electric supply contracts to up to five highly qualified generators rather than just award the contract to a single vendor for many years at one point in time. Not only does this provide the lowest pricing in the market, but it helps the Town avoid certain expenses resulting from long-term contracts. Addison currently pays 3.684 cents per kilowatt hour and hopes this program will bring that cost down over time.

In a related item, Council also approved a Commercial Electric Service Agreement (CESA) between the Town and GEXA Energy, the current Retail Electric Provider of TCAP to begin after January 1, 2023. GEXA schedules the purchased electricity on the ERCOT grid to meet member demands, bills member cities, settles the market at ERCOT, assists with new individual account establishment and account termination, and interfaces with Addison's Transmission and Distribution Company, ONCOR electric.

Case 1817-Z/UDR Fiori. Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on a 4.40-acre property located at 3990 Vitruvian Way, which is currently zoned PD, Planned Development, through Ordinance O07-034, as previously amended by ordinances O13-026, O16-017, and O19-06, by changing the density of the residential development.

Meetings will be open to the public, but masks are required and social distancing must be observed. Oncor Tower Replacement Update

The rain this week has slowed construction of the Oncor Tower Replacement project at Redding Trail, but the project is still on schedule. A full schedule is listed below:

August 10 – October 30: Install foundations and Line Construction

- A reduced portion of the Redding Trail Dog Park will open for use. Closures for construction required.
- The trail will be closed to the public.

November 1 – 30: Clean-up & Restoration

- Oncor will clean-up and repair damage to the landscape and irrigation.
- Addison parks crews will install the pedestrian light poles and replacement vegetation.
- The trail is closed out of precaution for safety. Please do not access the trail corridor. We will notify you when the trail re-opens in November.


