Council Update

Upcoming Public Hearing

The following public hearing will take place at the October 12 City Council Meeting. The <u>agenda will be posted</u> three days prior to the meeting.

Case 1838-Z/3820 Belt Line Road. Public Hearing on an Ordinance amending Planned Development (PD) District Ordinance O20-54 for a 2.034-acre property located at 3820 Belt Line Road, to modify minimum lot size requirements and to establish future cross-access requirements. In 2020, a two-story retail/office building was approved on the eastern portion of this site. However, the minimum lot size requirements of the current PD zoning do not allow for the site to be subdivided to permit the new office and the former Humperdink's building both to be on the same lot. The property owner, Addison Retail LLC, is requesting the amendment to modify the minimum lot size.

Addison Police Department Unveils Memorial to Fallen Officer Ronnie Cox



On October 2, the Addison Police Department was joined by the family, friends, and colleagues of fallen Addison Police Officer Ronnie Cox to unveil a memorial in his honor. Officer Cox was killed in the line of duty on December 15, 1986, and is APD's only line of duty death. During the dedication ceremony, many in attendance shared wonderful memories of Officer Cox and praised his dedication to protecting the Addison community. The memorial, which is located outside of the Addison Police Department, includes a bronze plaque and dedicated bench for reflection.

Unfortunately, due to a staff error, the dedication ceremony was posted for the wrong day on the Town's website. However, the police department is working with the family to be able to share a video taken during the event with anyone who was unable to attend. Time to Replace Smoke Detector Batteries



October is Fire Safety Month, which means it is time to replace your smoke detector batteries. The Addison Fire Department is supplying residents with 9-volt lithium batteries that residents can install themselves. These new batteries have 1200mAh capacity, a 10-year shelf life, and keep smoke detectors running up to five times longer than the standard 9-volt battery.

You will notice your new battery is marked with a red dot sticker. In addition, you will be given a red dot sticker to place on the outside of your smoke detector(s) once you have installed the new battery. These stickers indicate to the Addison Fire Department that your battery was installed in 2021.

Residents can pick up their batteries throughout the month of October at either of Addison's Fire Stations.
