Upcoming Public Hearings

The following public hearings will take place at the November 9 City Council Meeting. The [agenda will be posted](#) three days prior to the meeting.

Case 1836-SUP/4141 Spring Valley Road (Greenhill School Science Building): Public Hearing on an Ordinance on property located at 4141 Spring Valley Road, currently zoned R-1 Single Family Dwelling and Planned Development (PD) through Ordinance 084-092, for a Special Use Permit to allow a new private school building.

Case 1837-SUP/5100 Belt Line Road (The Low Key Poke Joint): Public Hearing on an Ordinance on property located at 5100 Belt Line Road, Suite 868, currently zoned Planned Development (PD), through Ordinance O12-002 and Ordinance O20-08, for a Special Use Permit to allow for the expansion of an existing restaurant with the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption only.

Case 1840-SUP/3719 Belt Line Road (Pokeworks): Public Hearing on an Ordinance on property located at 3719 Belt Line Road, currently zoned planned development (PD) through Ordinance O92-037, for a Special Use Permit to allow a restaurant.

You Can Now Dial 311 to Report Panhandling in Dallas

On November 1, the City of Dallas kicked off a six-month pilot program encouraging motorists to call 311 to report panhandling. Signs have been placed at nine intersections across Dallas urging drivers to report people soliciting donations to the city's non-emergency 311 number and to donate to nonprofits and organizations rather than directly to those asking for money. According to [The Dallas Morning News](#), city marshals and crisis intervention caseworkers will respond to areas where panhandling is reported and provide referrals to homeless service providers and other groups for help with housing, food, mental health, or physical ailments.

Most Addison residents might not realize that the Dallas Police Department has jurisdictional authority over all of the intersections along the Dallas Parkway (northbound and southbound) from Spring Valley Road to Frankford Road. They also have jurisdiction over the Belt Line Road intersections east of the Dallas North Tollway. When an incident, or panhandler, is reported along these streets, Dallas Police is dispatched to respond, although the Addison Police Department (APD) will provide backup support when it is requested.

Over the next six months, APD encourages residents to participate in Dallas' pilot program by calling 311 when they see people soliciting money at these Dallas intersections. If you see panhandling in Addison's borders, you can report it by calling Addison's non-emergency number at 972-450-7156 or *247 from your mobile phone.

Metrocrest Services Gala Kicks off Capital Campaign





On Saturday, October 30, Mayor Joe Chow, City Manager Wes Pierson, Economic Development & Tourism Director Orlando Campos, and Public Communications Director Mary Rosenbleeth represented Addison at the Metrocrest Services Gala. The event, which was held at the Renaissance Hotel, commemorated the organization's 50th anniversary and kicked off a capital campaign to build a 48,000 square foot facility at the intersection of Belt Line Road and Josey Lane in Carrollton. The goal of the \$15,800,000 initiative is to bring services to the heart of need in the community and remove barriers to access, ensuring equitable care and support for everyone.
