COVID-19 Vaccine Update



The Texas Department of State Health Services <u>announced on March 23</u> that beginning March 29 all adults in Texas will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. The vaccine supply is expected to increase and many areas of Texas have already made great strides with priority groups. Over 3 million Texans are fully vaccinated and over 6 million have received at least one dose.


Oncor Address Council at March 23 City Council Work Session

Council Discusses Sam's Club Special Area Study

Here's your Weekly Update from the Town of Addison, 3.26.21



During its March 23 Work Session, Council discussed the Sam's Club Special Area Study that was initiated in 2014. The study area runs from the former Sam's Club site south along the Midway Corridor, including the Midway Square Shopping Center and Office in the Park. The goal of a special area study is to provide a recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council regarding the future use of those sites after an in-depth analysis.

Over the past five years, the northern segment of the study area has experienced significant change through the implementation of the Addison Grove development and the fire that destroyed the Super 8 Motel. Council directed staff to expand the boundaries of the project south to Hornet Road, and to evaluate and make any needed modifications to the existing study to support the adoption of a comprehensive development policy for this area. An Advisory Committee will be appointed by City Council to guide this process. Applications for service on the committee will be available soon.

Addison Earns Bronze Fleet Award

Addison was named a Bronze Fleet Award winner by the Dallas-Fort Worth Clean Cities Coalition for its contributions and efforts in going the extra mile to reduce petroleum consumption and improve the air quality within Addison and North Texas. Addison's fleet, which has been recognized as a Clean Fleet City since 2015, was awarded recognition for the Town's emphasis on fleet idle reduction as well as the use of hybrid vehicles.

General Services Director Rob Bourestom, who presented the certificate to Council at the March 23 Council Meeting, shared that the Town currently has eight hybrids vehicles and one electric vehicle.

Local Teens Recognized for Life Saving Efforts



Police Chief Paul Spencer recognized three teens with a Citizens Certificate of Merit at the March 23 City Council Meeting. Francis French, Micah Lehman, and Zoe Newell were in Vitruvian Park in January when they observed a man climb onto a stack of rocks on the embankment under Bella Bridge and attempt to tie an orange rope around his neck. They ran up to the man, gave him a hug, told him that his life mattered, and said if he wanted to talk to them, he could. As he headed back to his apartment following the encounter, he told the young adults that they had saved his life. Addison Police Officers who responded to the incident found a suicide note in the man's pocket.

The quick and decisive actions of these young heroes saved a life and serve as an example of bravery and compassion to the community. The Addison Police Department commends them for their unselfish devotion to their fellow citizens.

Contactless Recycling Event Scheduled for April 17




Mark your calendar and clean out your closet. Addison is celebrating Earth Day and Sustainability Day on April 17 from 12pm - 3pm with a contactless recycling event at the Addison Service Center (16801 Westgrove Drive). The first 100 people receive a free tshirt. If you are interested in a tree sapling to plant in honor of Earth Day, those will be given out to interested attendees while supplies last.

In addition to onsite shredding services, Town employees will be collecting non-perishable and canned food items for donation to the Metrocrest Services Food Bank. The following items will also be accepted whether they are damaged, non-working, or fully operational:

- **Computers:** Desktops, laptops, servers, LCD monitors, keyboards, mics, speakers, and all other computer components.
- **Portable Electronics:** Cell phones, GPS devices, calculators, portable CD and DVD players, PDAs, and MP3 Players.
- Cameras: Camcorders and all non-disposable film and digital cameras.
- **Office Equipment:** Fax machines, typewriters, inkjet cartridges, printers, scanners, routers, shredders, and copiers.
- Entertainment Electronics: Car and home audio equipment, satellite and cable boxes, VCRs, DVD players and recorders, headphones, and multimedia projectors.
- **Multimedia:** DVD and VHS movies, audiobooks, and music CDs. All multimedia items must include original covers.
- Clothing & Accessories: Pants, coats, shirts, purses, belts, shoes, hats, etc.
- Toys & Games: Action figures, blocks, dolls, stuffed animals, etc.
- Video Games: Video games, systems, and accessories.
- **Sporting Goods:** Golf clubs and bags, athletic helmets and pads, baseball bats and gloves, basketball shoes, cleats, hockey sticks, ice skates, and rollerblades.
- **Musical Instruments:** Guitars, percussion, strings, woodwinds, brass, and electric keyboards.
- Home and Garden: Air purifiers, baby monitors, vacuum cleaners, power tools, electric razors, sewing machines, and medical equipment.
- Non-Fiction Books: Cookbooks, craft books, textbooks, etc.
- **Collectibles:** Comics, figurines, trading cards, etc.
- Pottery, Cookware & Glass Dinnerware: China, porcelain, pottery, stoneware, etc.

Your donations help ensure the proper recycling of e-waste and save valuable landfill space. A tax deduction slip will be provided for all donations. This is a free event and opens to Addison residents and non-Addison residents. Town employees will follow COVID-19 protocols for personal protective equipment and contactless collection.

Midway Road Revitalization Update



Construction crews have begun removing the medians and pavement at the Midway Road/Belt Line Road intersection to perform utility and pavement improvements. Drivers can expect to see various lane closures and traffic shifts as the phases of work rotate around the intersection. Please pay close attention to the signage in the area, as the lane functions (Left Turn Only, Right Turn Only, etc.) will change during the various phases of the work. The video above provides additional details about the projected phasing over the next several months.

Utility work is scheduled to begin on Midway Road the week of March 29 starting at Spring Valley Road and progressing northward. During this work, traffic will be shifted to the outer lanes as the work progresses along the center portion of the street and median areas. This work will include the removal of sections of median pavement, curb & gutter, and median trees to allow for the utility construction. Please note that no parkway trees will be removed at this time.

Follow CDC Social Distancing Guidelines



The Town of Addison is taking action to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We would like to encourage everyone to join us. The CDC has encouraged the community to practice social distancing, but also to follow these steps to minimize the spread of any disease:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).
