COVID-19 Vaccine Update



The state of Texas launched a new website on Monday, March 29 that will help people search for a shot across different COVID-19 vaccine providers. Through the [Texas Public Health Vaccine Scheduler](#), people can register for a shot and be matched with the next available appointment at a nearby vaccination site. Texans without access to the internet can call 1-833-832-7067 between the hours of 7am - 7pm to find a slot.

North Texas locations participating in the registration website include the City of Garland Health Department, the Rockwall County Health Authority and the Parker County Health Authority. Larger counties such as Dallas and Tarrant and private providers will still have their own systems.

Addison Police Present Annual Report

At the March 23 Council Meeting, Police Chief Paul Spencer presented the Addison Police Department's (APD) 2020 Annual Report. This report includes a statistical review of the year, notable events from the patrol and criminal investigation divisions, and goals and objectives for Fiscal Year 2021.

An important change in APD's reporting methodology took place in 2020. APD historically utilized the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program for the reporting of crime statistics. In December 2015, the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services Advisory Policy Board passed a recommendation to transition all federal, state, county, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies to the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) by 2021. In response to that directive, APD began using NIBRS in 2020. Implemented to improve the overall quality of crime data collected by law enforcement, NIBRS captures details on each single crime incident as well as on separate offenses within the same incident. The additional data includes information on victims, known offenders, relationships between victims and offenders, arrestees, and property involved in crimes. Unlike data reported through the UCR, NIBRS goes much deeper because of its ability to provide circumstances and context for crimes like location, time of day, and whether the incident was cleared.

NIBRS collects data for 52 offenses, plus 10 additional offenses for which only arrests are reported. UCR counts limited data for 10 offenses and 20 additional crimes for which only arrests are reported. Data collected by APD prior to 2020 under UCR will show a much lower incidence of crime than the data collected under NIBRS because the UCR data only covers a narrow range of criminal activity compared to NIBRS. Comparisons between UCR and NIBRS data will not provide an accurate representation of the annual change in overall criminal activity.

Council directed staff to expand the boundaries of the project south to Hornet Road and to evaluate and make any needed modifications to the existing study to support the adoption of a comprehensive development policy for this area. Oncor Town Replacement on Redding Trail Progressing

Oncor continues to make progress on restoring the Redding Trail following their tower installation project. Below is a recap of the repairs have been made recently and those that are still pending:

- Damages to the concrete sidewalk have been repaired.
- Damaged concrete light piers will be repaired by April 9.
- Irrigation repairs are complete from the dog park up to the western edge of the trail.
- Irrigation repairs are in progress from the south up to the north of the trail.
- Soil restoration is in progress to prepare for new sod.
- Sod installation will begin April 5.
- New sod installed in the dog park will be protected for two weeks to allow for root in.
- Once sod is rooted in at the dog park the temporary fence will be removed.

Oncor's restoration work is on track to be completed by the end of April. Once Oncor is off-site, Addison Parks crews will install the light poles, plant 25 screening trees at the southwest corner, replace the monument sign, replace rules signs, and replace the drinking fountains. It's the time of Year to Prepare for Egret and Heron Control and Addison Needs Your Help

The Parks and Recreation Department is asking residents to help deter egrets and herons from forming nesting colonies (rookeries) in Addison. Urban rookeries can cause noise, odor, public health hazards, and damage to property. The Town is already aware of Herons' nests in one neighborhood and is working with U.S. Department of Fish and Wildlife to proactively address and prevent further nesting. Residents can help by following these three simple steps:

1. Egrets and Herons like dense tree canopies and nest in trees that are 20' tall or greater. They like areas with contiguous canopy where large trees have grown together. You can be a big part of the solution by heavily thinning out the interior branches of your trees so they have 75% density or less. If possible, prune trees so they do not touch other trees. January and February is an ideal time to prune trees.
2. Familiarize yourself with what Egret and Herons native to our area look like.
3. If an Egret or Heron is beginning to build a nest in some cases the Parks and Recreation Department can deter the birds or remove the nest if eggs have not been laid. Please notify us if you think you have seen an Egret or Heron beginning to build a nest by emailing Matt Ansted at mansted@addisontx.gov. It's helpful if you include in your email the location, a description of the bird, and a photo if possible. You can also report sightings on Addison's [FixIT app](#).

In some cases, we may be able to use hazing tactics to encourage them to leave. Herons and egrets are protected under the Migratory Bird Act, so please do not harm them, their nests, eggs, or hatchlings.

Follow CDC Social Distancing Guidelines



The Town of Addison is taking action to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We would like to encourage everyone to join us. The CDC has encouraged the community to practice social distancing, but also to follow these steps to minimize the spread of any disease:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).
