COVID-19 Vaccine Update



Wednesday, April 7 Dallas County Judge Clay Jenkins said that there is no longer an appointment time or waiting list the get the COVID-19 vaccine, and residents should sign-up at www.dallascounty.org.

The drive-thru vaccination site at Ellis Davis Field House in Dallas at 9191 S. Polk Street is now allowing those without an appointment to get a shot between the hours of 11am and 4pm. Monday through Saturday. This vaccine hub is operated by Parkland Hospital.

Addison Held In-Person Town Meeting at Renaissance Hotel









Metrocrest Services Hosts Virtual Keyholders Breakfast



The Metrocrest Services hosted its annual Keyholder Breakfast virtually on April 8. Addison Council Members tuned in to help celebrate the organization's 50 years of serving the community. Since 1971, Metrocrest Services has provided services for individuals, families, and seniors that lead to self-sufficiency and foster independence. Services include emergency financial assistance, financial coaching, food pantry access, employment coaching and job readiness, senior services, and much more.

The agency has set a goal to raise \$1 million by October 30, 2021 to help meet its growing needs and build for the future as it expands into a new location and tends to the demanding need this year brought on by the pandemic, the winter storm and other challenges that have plagued North Texans. Since the COVID-19 pandemic began, Metrocrest Service's clientele has more than doubled, serving 33,998 clients in the past 12 months, an increase of 155% over the previous 12 months.

Follow CDC Social Distancing Guidelines



The Town of Addison is taking action to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We would like to encourage everyone to join us. The CDC has encouraged the community to practice social distancing, but also to follow these steps to minimize the spread of any disease:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and help young children do the same. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- · Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).
