Council Update

Addison Offices Closed For Memorial Day



Addison offices, including the Athletic Club, will be closed on Monday, May 31 in observance of Memorial Day. However, the outdoor pool at the club will be open from

noon - 7pm. If you need assistance during the holiday, please call the non-emergency public safety number at 972-450-7156.

Trash and recycling will be collected as usual on May 31.

Addison Facilities to Re-Open to the Public

This week Addison started the transition back to pre-pandemic operations. For the Athletic Club, this process consists of moving equipment back into place, restarting programs, and opening facilities that were closed. On Saturday, June 5, the club will return to its regular hours of operation and on Monday, June 7, Town offices will reopen to the public.

At its May 25 meeting, the Addison City Council adopted the Town's first City-Wide Trails Master Plan. A trails master plan was recommended by the Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan that was adopted on April 25, 2019. On February 13, 2020, Council approved a contract with Moore Iacofano Goltsman, Inc. (MIG) to develop Addison's plan and on April 14, 2020, Council appointed a Trails Master Plan Advisory Committee (PAC) to provide input and feedback. From May 2020 through April 2021, public input was gathered for the plan, updates were presented to Council, and the plan was refined to address feedback from both the community and the Council.

The purpose of a Trails Master Plan is to identify safe and comfortable pedestrian and bicycle facilities that connect residents, visitors, and employees to local and regional recreation, amenities, and destinations. Addison's new plan articulates a long-term vision for a fully built out trail network throughout Addison that is a critical piece of the larger regional trail network, but also delineates short-term and medium-term priorities.

Jeni's Splendid Ice Cream is Coming to Addison

The City Council approved a Special Use Permit at its May 25 meeting for Jeni's Splendid Ice Cream. The new artisanal ice cream shop will be located next to Shake Shack in Prestonwood Center.

Founded in Columbus, Ohio in 2002 by James Beard Award-winning ice cream maker Jeni Britton Bauer, Jeni's Splendid Ice Creams makes one-of-a-kind flavors in partnership with the growers, makers, and producers who supply them with ingredients, from family-run dairies to farmers who grow fields of berries just for their ice cream. The shop hopes to be open in two and half months.

Council Approves Temporary Buildings at Greenhill School

The City Council approved a special use permit for seven portable temporary classrooms at Greenhill School at its May 25 meeting. The most recent anticipated campus upgrade at Greenhill School is the reconstruction of an existing science building. In order to complete this project, the school will need to temporarily place seven portable buildings, six to serve as temporary classrooms and one to house the bathrooms for these classrooms. This triggers the requirement for a new Special Use Permit to ensure that the quantity, location, appearance, and duration of the use of the proposed temporary classrooms are compatible with surrounding site conditions.

The new science building is anticipated to be complete in August 2023. The permit requires the removal of the temporary buildings no later than January 1, 2024, or within 30 days of issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. If these deadlines are not met, Council can reconsider the subject.

Council Receives Quarterly Financial Report for the Second Quarter of Fiscal Year 2021

Addison's financial policies require the publication of a financial report 60 days subsequent to the end of each fiscal quarter. The financial and investment reports presented to Council at its May 25 meeting covered the financial performance for the second quarter for

the Fiscal Year 2021 (January 1, 2021 - March 31, 2021). The financial report includes information for the following funds: General, Hotel, Economic Development, Airport, Utility, and Stormwater.

Key highlights for the second quarter include:

- General Fund revenue totaled \$29.7 million, which is 76.5 percent of the fiscal year budget.
- General Fund expenditures totaled \$17.3 million, which is 43.8 percent of the fiscal year budget.
- Sales tax collections totaled \$6.9 million, which is 55.7 percent of the fiscal year budget.
- The Hotel Fund had revenue of \$797 thousand and expenditures of \$1.4 million, which is \$1.1 million less (revenue) than this time a year ago.
- Performing Arts expenditures are at 88.8 percent due to the full payment of the Water Tower Theatre grant.
- Special Events revenues totaled 4.0 percent, and expenses totaled 1.7 percent of the fiscal year budget due to the timing of events.
- Airport Fund operating revenue totaled \$2.8 million or 53.4 percent, and operating expenditures totaled \$2.2 million or 42.7 percent of the fiscal year budget.
- Utility Fund operating revenue totaled \$5.2 million or 37.1 percent, and expenditures totaled \$6.5 million or 45.8 percent of the fiscal year budget. This is in line with historical averages (seasonally low water usage).
- Stormwater Fund revenue and expenditures are in line with historical averages.

Addison Environmental Health Division Offers Free Mosquito Dunks to Help Residents Control Mosquitoes



To help Addison residents reduce the number of mosquitoes on their property, the Addison Environmental Health Division is giving away free Mosquito Dunks to residents while supplies lasts. Mosquito Dunks® are small, donut-shaped objects that float on the surface of the standing water and release bacteria that kill mosquito larvae in the water before they become adults. A single dunk will treat an area of about 100 square feet.

Always Follow the Label Instructions when using Mosquito Dunks® or any other pesticide. It is important to know the approximate dimensions of your area to ensure that you get the proper number of dunks for effective treatment.

Mosquito Dunks® will be available, free of charge, for pickup at the Addison Athletic Club (3900 Beltway Drive) and the Addison Service Center (16801 Westgrove Drive) from Tuesday, June 1 through Friday, June 4, or while supplies last. There is a two-package per household limit.

"The free dunks are a great way for all of us to help control the mosquito population and protect ourselves and the community from vector-borne diseases," said Sandra Long, Environmental Health Manager. "To help keep your property mosquito-free, be sure to check your property for any items that can hold water and empty the water from these items on a regular basis."
