Council Update

Council Discussed Strategic Plan for Fiscal Year 2022

During a special council meeting on Wednesday, June 16, the City Council reviewed its [strategic pillars and milestones from Fiscal Year 2021](#). The Council decided to tweak its strategic pillars and replaced some of the ten milestones for Fiscal Year 2022. The pillars and milestones will drive budgetary decisions and set the priorities for staff in the coming year. Council will adopt the pillars and milestones at an upcoming City Council Meeting.

Council Holds Joint Meeting with Planning and Zoning Commission

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, the City Council's Strategic Plan included a milestone to review Town ordinances and regulations to modernize them and facilitate redevelopment. To address this strategic need, the Town engaged Clarion Associates in June 2018 to review the Town's current development regulations and to create a new Unified Development Code (UDC) shaped by a robust public review process.

The UDC drafting and review process is comprised of four code drafting phases, a testing phase, and public review and adoption of the consolidated UDC document. The four code drafting phases are:

- Zoning Districts and Uses
- Development and Design Standards
- Administration and Procedures
- Signs and Communication Facilities

The process was suspended at the conclusion of the first code drafting phase due to a combination of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the departure of the Development Services Director. At a June 17 joint meeting between the Addison City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission, the project team reintroduced the project and facilitated a targeted discussion of Part I of the Development and Design Standards phase. The City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission provided feedback on proposed development standards addressing flood prevention, grading and drainage, and site access and circulation.

Due to its size and complexity, the Development and Design Standards phase will be carried out over a four-month period and will include three site visits from the Clarion Associates team. For each site visit, the project team will facilitate a project advisory committee meeting, and a joint meeting of the City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission. Smaller, informal community outreach events will be held throughout the review period, while a larger, more comprehensive community open house event will be held at the end of the Development Standards review phase.

Kaboom Town Tickets Available June 21 to the General Public



Addison Kaboom Town! will return on July 3! In addition to the 25-minute fireworks show, this year's festivities will include the Addison Airport Freedom Flyover which will feature multiple historic plane flyovers, similar to the Salute to Heroes event last May. A townwide party, the fireworks and flyover viewing options include watch parties at many of Addison's 180+ restaurants or 22 hotels, and a limited-capacity party at Addison Circle Park. This year, due to limited park capacity, free tickets will be required for entry. Those tickets will be available beginning at 10am on June 21 at [AddisonKaboomTown.com](https://www.addisonkaboomtown.com), and are expected to sell out quickly.

A limited number of tickets have been set aside for Addison residents to reserve before the public ticket portal opens. Postcards with more details were mailed to all residents. The deadline for residents to reserve tickets is Sunday, June 20 at noon.

Midway Road Revitalization Update



Utility work continues on the Midway Road Revitalization Project at the Belt Line/Midway intersection and from Hornet Drive to Proton Road. Over the next few weeks, crews will be replacing the large waterline valves in the intersection and installing new waterlines across Belt Line Road. This work is being completed in phases to minimize the impact on area businesses as much as possible.

Nearly one-fourth of the new waterline has already been installed from Spring Valley to Belt Line. This work is running concurrently with the pipe and valve replacement at the intersection to expedite the revitalization efforts.

Various lane closures will continue to occur over the next several weeks as the work progresses. Some work will be performed during evening hours to minimize the impact on utility service in the area. We are still on schedule to have the new paving in the southern portion of the project completed by Fall 2022.
