Council Update

Dallas County Reinstates Mask Requirement



On August 11, Dallas County Judge Clay Jenkins issued an <u>Emergency Executive</u>
Order requiring face coverings in certain public places including schools, businesses (defined as commercial entities in Dallas County providing goods and services to the public), and Dallas County buildings and facilities. The Order, which took effect at 11:59pm on August 11, was expanded on Thursday night to include mask mandates for colleges and contact-tracing for schools. It does not, however, impact city-owned buildings, like recreation centers and libraries.

Jenkins' Order comes after a Dallas district judge issued a temporary restraining order late on Tuesday, August 10 that restricts enforcement of Governor Greg Abbott's ban on mask mandates. As you may recall, on July 29 Governor Greg Abbott issued <u>Executive Order38</u> prohibiting government officials or governmental entities from imposing mask mandates. Governor Abbott and Attorney General Ken Paxton filed a petition in the state's 5th Court of Appeals to block Judge Jenkins' Order on Wednesday and Judge Jenkins filed a response yesterday. Addison is closely monitoring the rapidly changing and ongoing legal conflict on this matter. Once it has reached its final conclusion, Addison is prepared to respond accordingly.

The health of our community is a top priority, so in the meantime, Addison is encouraging members of the public to wear masks as they deem appropriate, wash hands or use hand sanitizer frequently, practice social distancing as necessary, and to stay home when sick. Vaccinations are also encouraged and you can find a local vaccine provider at www.vaccines.gov.

Addison will continue to provide updates on its websites and social media channels, as well as through the newsletter.

Council Authorizes Issuance and Refunding of Bonds

Since 2012, Addison voters have approved several bond programs to fund various projects throughout Town. Once voter approval is secured, the City Council is authorized

to issue bonds to pay for those projects. At its August 10 meeting, the City Council approved the issuance of \$16,095,000 in 2021 General Obligation Bonds to fund the following:

- \$8,000,000, from the authorized \$16,000,000 (\$3,000,000 issued to date), from Proposition 1 of the 2012 Bond Election for reconstruction of Midway Road. Council awarded a construction contract to Tiseo Construction on December 8, 2020. The project is currently under construction with an anticipated completion date in Fiscal Year 2024.
- \$3,145,000, from the authorized \$6,723,000 (\$365,000 issued to date), from Proposition C of the 2019 Bond Election for parks and recreation improvements and facilities. Council approved a contract for the design of locker room, pool, and gymnasium and track improvements to the Addison Athletic Club on June 9, 2020. Design is nearing completion with construction anticipated to begin in Fall 2021 with an estimated construction timeline of 12-24 months.
- \$4,950,000, from the authorized \$7,395,000 (\$140,000 issued to date), from <u>Proposition D of the 2019 Bond Election</u> for improvements to existing municipal buildings.

The financial impacts of the bond issuance were less than the projections included in the materials provided to the public as part of the 2019 Bond Election process. The bonds were issued for 20 years with an interest rate of 1.769% as well as a \$1.47 million premium which resulted in a lower issuance principal amount of \$14,850,000. After payment of bond issuance costs, the Town will still receive the \$16 million needed for these projects.

At its August 10 meeting, Council also approved the refunding (i.e. refinancing) of the 2013 General Obligation Bonds and 2013A General Obligation Bonds at a rate of 1.474%. The interest rate will result in a debt savings of more than \$120,000 a year, with a Net Present Value savings in excess of \$1.3 million, over the remaining life of the debt.

Council Rezones Property on Beltway Drive and Approves Concept Plan for Medical Office

At its August 10 meeting, the City Council approved a request to rezone a vacant 1.17 acre parcel of land located on Beltway Drive, just south of Belt Line Road behind Cantina Laredo, from Local Retail (LR) to Commercial-1 (C-1) district. Council also approved a concept plan for a speculative medical office building on this property.

Council Extends Agreement with BKD, LLP to Perform Financial Audits

As part of the Town's Charter requirement and financial best practices, Addison engages an independent audit firm to conduct an annual financial audit. At its August 10 meeting, the City Council approved a three-year professional services agreement with BKD, LLP to perform this service. BKD, LLP has been the Town's external audit firm since 2016 and was selected for a contract extension through a Request for Qualifications process.

BKD, LLP is a national CPA and advisory firm that offers clients a variety of services in accounting, audit and assurance, tax, risk management, technology, corporate finance, forensic and valuation services and wealth management. Firm-wide, they serve approximately 240 governmental entities in Texas, 25 of which are municipalities. The local office, which will service this audit, is located in Addison.

Bowlmor Lanes, located at 3805 Belt Line Road, is operated by Bowlero Corporation. Bowlero operates nearly 300 bowling centers, making it the largest ten-pin bowling center operator in the world. In 2018, Bowlero rebranded from Bowlmor AMF to Bowlero and, in order to accurately reflect this rebranding, they recently submitted a sign permit application to update existing attached and detached signage at their Addison location. At its August 10 meeting, the City Council approved a meritorious exception to the Town's sign ordinance to allow Bowlero to install signage that is larger than is allowed by the ordinance due to the limited visibility of this facility from Belt Line Road.

<u>Case 1835-SUP/Pressed Juicery:</u> Public hearing on a recommendation regarding an ordinance changing the zoning on property located at 5290 Belt Line Road, Suite 104, which property is currently zoned PD, Planned Development, through Ordinance O19-22, by approving a Special Use Permit for a new restaurant.
