January 11 Proclaimed VisionsForConfidence Day in Addison

At the January 11 City Council Meeting, Mayor Joe Chow proclaimed January 11, 2022 as VisionsForConfidence (V4C) Day in Addison. Three members of the V4C team, Madeleine

Chen, Ariana Wang, and Kaelyn Lee, attended the meeting and accepted the proclamation on behalf of the organization.

<u>VisionsForConfidence</u> (V4C) is a non-profit performing arts organization co-founded by Madeleine Chen and Elizabeth Echt, two rising sophomores at The Hockaday School. The V4C co-founders have dedicated their passion for the performing arts to providing scholarships supporting talented young artists with financial needs to pursue continued art training. V4C also provides financial support and works with children who have special needs, introducing them to a world of Performing Arts to which they never would have had access.

Addison to Contribute to Metrocrest Services' Building Our Future Capital Campaign

For over 50 years, Metrocrest Services has provided a variety of programs for Addison residents such as a food pantry, job skills training, senior programs, and rent assistance. In July 2021, Metrocrest Services asked Addison to support their *Building Our Future* capital campaign with a \$120,000 contribution. The campaign seeks funding for the construction of Metrocrest's new Community Support Facility, a \$15.8 million project which broke ground in November 2021 and is slated to open in the spring of 2023. The request was discussed by Council during the <u>August 24, 2021</u> and <u>December 14, 2021</u> Council meetings.

At its January 11 meeting, Council approved a \$120,000 <u>Reimbursement Grant Funding</u> <u>Agreement</u> between Addison and Metrocrest Services for the campaign. One of the key provisions of the grant is that Metrocrest agrees that the new building will be designed, developed, and constructed for the purpose of providing the Town's residents enhanced access to local social services including, but not limited to:

- · Expanded case management services, space, and staff
- · Center for employment and continued education
- Expanded food pantry and warehouse
- Mobile pantry truck program capabilities
- Volunteer center with training kitchen

- Teaching garden with a nutritional program
- · Shared space to offer complementary services

Membership-based Primary Care Practice Eyes Prestonwood Place

In June 2019, the City Council approved the rezoning of Prestonwood Place Shopping Center to allow for façade improvements to all existing buildings, landscape and pedestrian improvements throughout the site, and extensive improvements to the building that is now home to Catapult Health. The rezoning, however, was not amended at that time to allow medical offices as a permitted use. Addison's zoning ordinance defines medical use as an office for the examination and treatment of outpatients, including dental examinations and treatments.

One Medical, a membership-based primary care practice, is considering occupying a tenant space at the northeast quadrant of the center. At its January 11 meeting, the City Council voted to approve an amendment to the center's zoning to permit medical use, making way for this new tenant.

Council Refinances Certificates of Obligation

At its January 11 meeting, Council approved the refunding (i.e. refinancing) of the 2012 Certificates of Obligation at a rate of 1.66%. The interest rate will result in debt savings of approximately \$68,000 a year, with a Net Present Value savings in excess of \$868,000, over the remaining life of the debt.

Bella Lane Construction Contract Approved



At its January 11 meeting, the City Council approved a contract for just under \$3 million with Tiseo Paving Company for street paving, bridge installation, water and stormwater infrastructure, landscaping, and the construction of a detention pond associated with the Bella Lane South Extension and Alpha Road Connector Project. This project will extend Bella Lane in Addison through Brookhaven College to Alpha Road in Farmers Branch. The total project budget is \$3.68M and is being shared between the Town of Addison (\$1.6 million), UDR (\$1.6 million), and Farmers Branch (\$480,000). Addison's contribution is funded through bonds dedicated to Vitruvian development public infrastructure.

Construction work is anticipated to begin in early March and is expected to take approximately 12 months to complete. Once completed and accepted, Addison will only maintain the portion of the road within the Town limits. Farmers Branch and Dallas County Community College District will be responsible for all other maintenance outside of the Town limits.

Special Council Meeting

The City Council will hold a Special Council Meeting on Wednesday, January 19 to interview master developer finalists for the Town's transit-oriented development project at Addison Circle. As is permitted by Texas law, the interviews will be held in an Executive Session and will not be open to the public. At this time there are ongoing negotiations between multiple parties, but once a finalist is selected more information will be shared with the public.

The agenda will be posted here three days prior to the meeting.



Addison Announces Dates for 2022 Special Events

Addison is known as the place to gather and celebrate with great music, food, and fun. <u>Taste Addison</u>, a celebration of food, music, and fun, will take place June 3-4 in Addison Circle Park. This ever-popular sampling of the Addison social experience highlights dozens of delicious bites from the Town's best restaurants and live performances from acclaimed musical acts.

Addison Kaboom Town! arrives on July 3. The dazzling, nationally renowned fireworks show takes to the skies in celebration of Independence Day. The Town watch party in Addison Circle Park will feature food and drink vendors, musical entertainment, and family friendly activities. As a townwide celebration, the festivities extend beyond the park with watch parties hosted by many of the Town's 200 restaurants. Prior to the fireworks, the Addison Airport Airshow will return this year with a captivating show visible throughout the Town.

The third weekend of September, experience <u>Addison Oktoberfest</u>, an authentic German Oktoberfest with a Texas twist. The four-day celebration of Bavarian culture and cuisine will take place Sept. 15-18. With polka dancing, traditional German games, folk music, and Paulaner bier, Addison's Oktoberfest is known as the most authentic outside of Munich.

In addition to the three major festivals, Addison will also hold several smaller events through its <u>Addison After Dark</u> series. On the third Saturday of each month between April and November (except in September, when Addison Oktoberfest takes its place), a different themed gathering will take place at 7pm in Addison Circle Park. Themes range from '80s Night Out to Harvest Hootenanny and guests are encouraged to dress according to the theme for each one. These monthly nights of free entertainment feature live music, food and beverage vendors, games, and more.
