Council Update

July 12 is Officially Wes Pierson Day in Addison





At the July 12 City Council meeting, Mayor Joe Chow presented a proclamation to City Manager Wes Pierson to recognize his many accomplishments over the past seven years with Addison and thank him for his service to the community. Wes was recently named the next City Manager for the City of Frisco and his official last day with Addison is August 1.

The City Council has hired a search firm to assist with hiring a new City Manager for Addison and appointed Executive Director of Business Performance and Innovation Hamid Khaleghipour to serve as Interim City Manager beginning August 2.

Council Gets Update on Construction Projects Around Town



The Public Works and Engineering Department maintains 37 signalized intersections; 167 lane miles of roadway; over 5,000 signs; 96 miles of water mains; 1,100 fire hydrants; 76 miles of storm water mains; and 72 miles of sanitary sewer mains. They also manage \$100 million in bond projects. Public Works and Engineering Director Shannon Hicks gave the City Council an update on key department operations, capital improvement projects, and bond projects for Fiscal Year 2022 at the July 12 meeting.

Addison Grove Developer Requests Development Plan Approval for Next Building Phase



At its July 12 meeting, the City Council considered a request for Development Plan approval for Block D of the Addison Grove addition, including a site plan, landscape plan, building elevations, and floor plans for 54 townhome lots and one open space lot located on approximately 2.08 acres at the southwest corner of Magnolia Street and Runyon Road. As part of this next phase, an 8-inch waterline connection between Magnolia Street and Beltway Drive must be made prior to the release of any Block D building permits. This will require removing a portion of the brick wall and installing retractable bollards to prohibit traffic other than public safety vehicles from accessing the Addison Grove neighborhood off of Beltway Drive. Council authorized the waterline connection work but tabled the Development Plan approval pending answers from the applicant to additional questions related to the building process and its impacts on the wall along Beltway.



<u>Case 1851-Z/AMLI Midway.</u> Hold a Public Hearing on a recommendation regarding an Ordinance rezoning a 13.78+/- acre property located on the west side of Midway Road, approximately 1,000 feet south of Beltway Drive and immediately north of the Redding Trail Dog Park, from Planned Development District (PD) to a new Planned Development District (PD) to allow for the development of 405 multifamily dwelling units with permitted ground floor retail, restaurant, office, co-working, and live/work uses, 30 townhome fee simple lots, 14 townhome rental dwelling units, and associated public and private open space and common areas, through the approval of development plans and standards.

<u>Sam's Club Special Area Study.</u> Hold a Public Hearing on the <u>Sam's Club Special Area</u> <u>Study</u>, a Long-Range Planning Policy Guiding Future Development and the Provision of Infrastructure and Social Amenities within a 79+/- Acre Area Bounded by Belt Line Road to the North, Hornet Road to the South, Midway Road to the East, and existing residential neighborhoods to the West. Midway Road Update - Traffic Switch Coming Soon

Here's your Weekly Update from the Town of Addison, 7.15.22



Main lane pavement replacement for the Midway Road Revitalization Project has been completed for the northbound lanes from Spring Valley Road to Proton Drive. The driveways, sidewalks, barrier-free ramps, retaining walls, and other amenities are now being constructed along the eastern side of the northbound lanes. Once these are complete, the traffic will be moved onto the new pavement to allow the southbound lanes from Spring Valley to Proton to be reconstructed. The <u>traffic switch</u> is scheduled for the last week of July.

The new sanitary sewer lines continue to be installed just south of Belt Line Road. At the same time utility crews are continuing to work on the installation of the new water and sanitary sewer lines in the northern segment of the project between Keller Springs Road and Belt Line Road. On-going DART Silver Line construction also continues just north of the Arapaho Bridge crossing.


Bella Lane Extension Taking Shape



At its January 11 meeting, the City Council approved a contract for just under \$3 million with Tiseo Paving Company for street paving, bridge installation, water and stormwater infrastructure, landscaping, and the construction of a detention pond associated with the Bella Lane South Extension and Alpha Road Connector Project. This project will extend Bella Lane in Addison through Brookhaven College to Alpha Road in Farmers Branch. The total project budget is \$3.68M and is being shared between the Town of Addison (\$1.6 million), UDR (\$1.6 million), and Farmers Branch (\$480,000). Addison's contribution is funded through bonds dedicated to Vitruvian development public infrastructure.

Construction work began in March 2022 and the contractor is making significant progress. The 14-acre-foot (over 600,000 cubic feet) detention pond has been excavated, all underground utilities are complete, and the roadway paving is over halfway done. The project is well on track to be completed prior to the March 2023 deadline.

Full Closure of Surveyor Boulevard at DART Rail Line Begins August 1



DART's Silver Line design-build contractor Archer Western Herzog (AWH) is planning a complete street closure of Surveyor Boulevard at the DART rail crossing beginning on Monday, August 1. The closure is to complete the replacement of the Surveyor Road crossing for the DART Silver Line Regional Rail. The work is expected to take eight weeks to complete.

Addison Airport Pavement Markings Project

Addison Airport is scheduled to complete its runway project with overnight closures beginning on Friday, July 15. The runway markings and all markings within the runway safety areas will be completed, along with markings on Taxiway Alpha. The closure schedule is as follows:

Friday, July 15: 6pm to 8am Saturday, July 16: 6pm to 12pm Sunday, July 17: 8pm to 6am Monday, July 18: 10pm to 6am if needed

The airport will be closed to all aircraft operations except helicopter traffic. All helicopter traffic will need to request prior permission at least 12 hours in advance before operating on the airport. 
Utility Billing Update to Take Place July 20 - 21
