Council Update

City Manager Submits Proposed Fiscal Year 2023 Budget to Council

Addison City Manager Wes Pierson shared his <u>proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2023</u> with the City Council on July 29. Addison's Charter requires that it be submitted by midnight on July 31. The City Council will hold a Budget Work Session on August 3 at 5pm at the Addison TreeHouse to discuss the proposed budget. If the discussion is not concluded on August 3, a second Budget Work Session will be held on August 4 beginning at 5pm at the Addison Treehouse. The meetings are open to the public and can also be viewed on the Town's website. Over the next two months, there will be two opportunities for the public to participate in the budget process: September 6 and September 13. You can find other important budget dates here. The new budget year will begin on October 1.

Planning and Zoning Commission Public Meeting Input

The Planning & Zoning Commission generally meets on the third Tuesday of every month at 6pm at the Addison TreeHouse. Meeting_agendas are posted 72 hours prior to the meeting. Members of the community are encouraged to address the Commission during the posted Public Hearings but public input can also be submitted via email to the Development Services Department at zoninginput@addisontx.gov. Emails that are received are shared with the Planning & Zoning Commissioners and will also now be available on the Town's website following the meeting.

New Midway Road Lane Shifts



The next phase of the Midway Road Revitalization Project is the removal and replacement of the existing pavement on the southbound lanes from Proton Drive to Spring Valley Lane. Traffic was switched over to the new pavement on the northbound lanes Friday, July 29 after the morning rush hour. The traffic configuration will have one lane of traffic in each direction and a continuous left turn lane in the center.

Drivers should pay close attention to the traffic control and lane assignments in this area and observe the location of signal heads and directional signage at the intersections.

Full Closure of Surveyor Boulevard at DART Rail Line Begins August 1



DART's Silver Line design-build contractor Archer Western Herzog (AWH) is planning a complete street closure of Surveyor Boulevard at the DART rail crossing beginning on Monday, August 1. The closure is to complete the replacement of the Surveyor Road crossing for the DART Silver Line Regional Rail. The work is expected to take eight weeks to complete.

Addison's Drought Contingency Plan

As you might have noticed, several communities in the surrounding area have instituted their drought contingency plans. Currently, Addison does not meet the criteria to enter into any water restrictions in accordance with the Drought Contingency Plan (<u>Article V</u> of The Town of Addison Code of Ordinances).

In order to enact water restrictions, one of the two criteria below must be met:

- 65% storage level of all raw water supply lakes. These are currently at just over 88%. Visit https://waterdatafortexas.org/reservoirs/municipal/dallas for up-to-date levels.
- 85% demand of the Town's contracted water capacity of 11 million gallons for four consecutive days. To date, the Town has only had one day that exceeded 85%

Town staff is keeping a close eye on the situation and will inform the community if the situation changes. Please visit the <u>Addison Water Conservation Plan webpage</u> for water conservation tips.

Brazilian Federal Highway Police Delegation Visits Addison Town Hall



On Tuesday, July 26, Mayor Joe Chow, Executive Director of Business Performance and Innovation Hamid Khaleghipour, and Addison Police Lieutenant Brian Pietsch welcomed a delegation from the Brazilian Federal Highway Police to Town Hall. The group wanted to learn more about Addison's use of license plate readers (LPRs) and the Addison Police Department's (APD) new in-car cameras and body cameras. The Addison City Council approved the purchase of the LPRs from Vigilant Solutions in April 2021 and the new incar and body cameras for APD from Axon Systems in August 2021. Representatives from Vigilant Solutions asked Addison to host this law enforcement group and share the Town's experiences.
