Council Update

Town Offices Closed on September 5 for Labor Day

Town of Addison offices, including the Athletic Club, will be closed on Monday, September 5 in observance of Labor Day. The Athletic Club outdoor pool will be open from 1pm - 6pm on Saturday, September 3 through Monday, September 5. If you need assistance when offices are closed, please call the non-emergency dispatch number at 972-450-7156 or *247 from a mobile phone.

Trash and recycling will be collected on its regular schedule. Please note that CWD does not always adhere to its regular schedule on holidays, so make sure that trash is placed outside after 6pm on Sunday night or before 7am Monday morning.

New Public Art Coming to Addison Circle Area Parks



At its August 23 meeting, the City Council approved two new sculptures proposed by the Addison Arbor Foundation. The first is a sculpture of three bronze coyotes to be placed in Beckert Park at the northwest corner of Spectrum Road and Addison Circle Road. The grouping has been created by Loveland, Colorado artist Joshua Tobey and is titled "The Three Tenors." The coyotes will be arranged as if they are singing and each one is named after a member of the operatic singing group the Three Tenors: Placido, Jose, and Luciano. The coyotes are approximately 33-35" tall and 11-17" wide.

The second sculpture approved is a 63" tall and 37" wide bronze bear to be located at the northeast corner of the Addison Circle Park Pavilion. Aptly named Meditation, the bear is depicted sitting in a meditative pose and will be situated adjacent to where yoga classes are held.

Council Receives Special Events Update



Interim Special Events Director Yesenia Saldivar presented Council financial and operations reconciliation reports for Taste Addison and Kaboom Town! as well as an update on Oktoberfest at the August 23 City Council Meeting. A total of 25 Addison food establishments participated in Taste Addison 2022 which attracted almost 14,000 attendees to Addison Circle Park on June 3-4. The event, which is funded through Addison's hotel fund, generated 210 hotel room nights. Event expenditures exceeded revenues by \$553,718. However, Taste Addison's marketing generated more than 83 million impressions through media buys, in-kind media sponsorships, and public relations efforts. Kaboom Town! attracted 13,000 people to Addison Circle Park, but more than 500,000 to Addison, and generated more than 928 hotel room nights. Event expenditures exceeded revenues by \$303,799, which was less than what was budgeted. You can <u>watch the Council's Kaboom Town discussion here</u> and <u>read the presentation here</u>.



Ms. Saldivar also shared a preview of Addison's 35th Oktoberfest. The event will take place from September 15 - 18 at Addison Circle Park. Thursday and Sunday will be free and adult tickets are \$10 on Friday and Saturday. Although ticket packages have already sold out, individual tickets are still available. 
WaterTower Theatre Production of Bridges of Madison County to Run September 7 - 11
