### Council Updates

#### City Council Approves Special Use Permit for White Rock Chapel

At a Special Meeting on December 4, the Addison City Council approved a Special Use Permit request for White Rock Chapel to allow a religious institution at 5555 Celestial Road. Former slaves and their descendants established the original White Rock Chapel east of the creek in 1884. After enduring flooding for years, the church moved to its current location in 1918 on land donated by a white landowner who frequently worshipped with their congregation. The property is currently owned by Dr. Donald Wesson and his family who plan to continue to use the site as a church and provide associated educational programming addressing the unique history of the site, congregation, and its relationship to the surrounding area.

Improvements to the site include interior and exterior modifications to the Worship Hall, a new pavilion, new landscaping, a small water feature internal to the site, pedestrian pathways, and improvements to the parking lot. The church will utilize both the existing Fellowship Hall and Worship Hall. There are no renovations proposed to the existing 618-square-foot Fellowship Hall which includes an assembly area, kitchen, restroom facilities, and storage area. There are improvements planned to the interior floor plan and exterior facade of the Worship Hall, but no expansion of the existing building. The structure is 1,961 square feet and will accommodate a 54-occupant assembly hall, an office, restroom facilities, a classroom, and a storage area.

The church's decomposed parking lot will be modified to accommodate two handicap-accessible spaces and will have a total of 18 spaces on site (including the handicap spaces). Per the Town's on-street parking regulations, parking on Celestial Road and Winwood Road is prohibited.

More than 70% of the site is landscaped open space, significantly exceeding the required 20%. Additionally, 72 new trees (47 shade trees and 25 ornamental trees) will be installed throughout the site to provide screening from adjacent properties. A bioretention pond is also proposed at the southeast corner of the site.

#### Upcoming Public Hearings

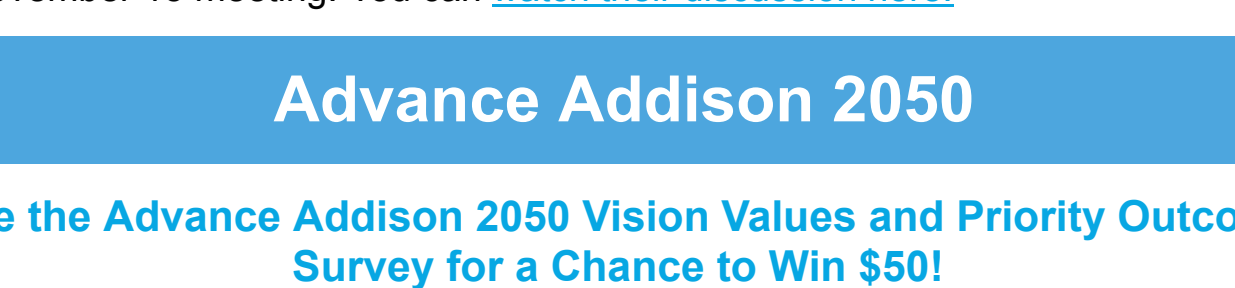
The following Public Hearings will take place at the December 12 City Council meeting that will be held at the Addison Conference Centre. The agenda will be posted [on the Council's website](#) three days prior to the meeting.

- **Case 1899-SUPH14665 Midway Road, Suite 155 (Career Discovery Academy).** Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request for a Special Use Permit (SUP) for property located at 14665 Midway Road, Suite 155, that is currently zoned Local Retail (LR), to allow an educational institution.
- **Case 1902-SUP13795 Belt Line Road (McDonald's).** Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend Special Use Permit (SUP), Ordinance No. 097104, for property located at 3795 Belt Line Road, that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), to allow modifications to the development plan.

#### December Planning & Zoning Commission Meeting Canceled

Due to a lack of agenda items, the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting scheduled for Wednesday, December 13 has been canceled.

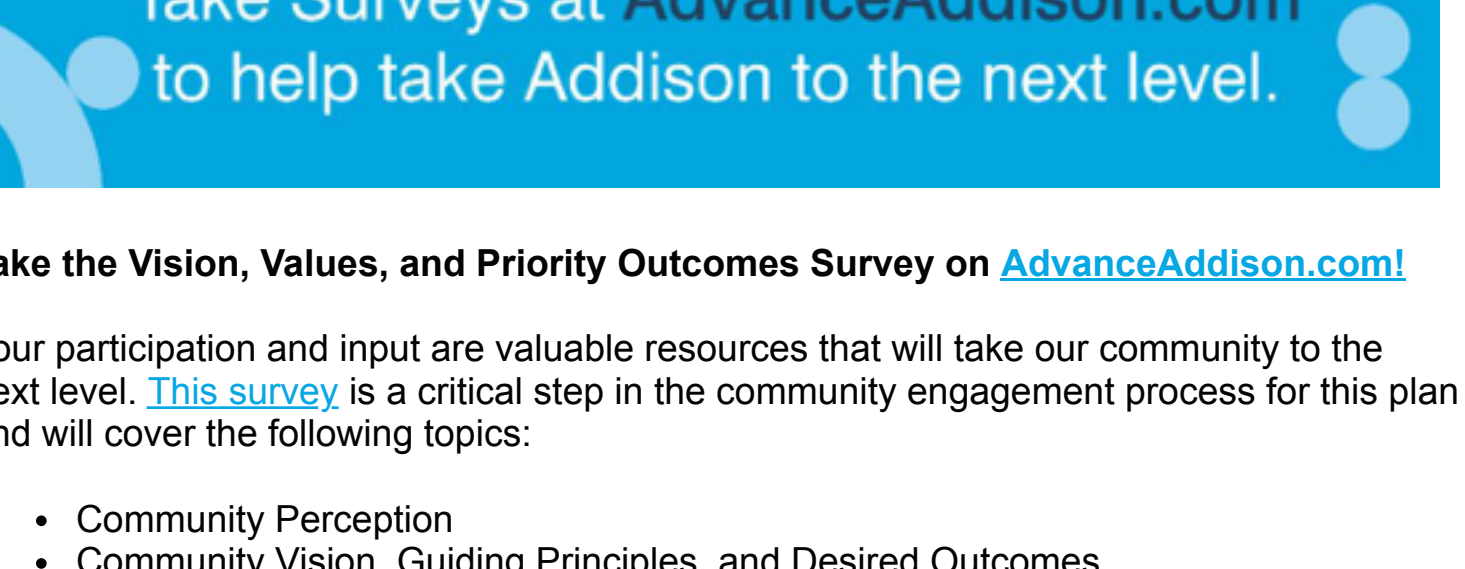
#### Unified Development Code (UDC) Sections Available for Review through the End of December

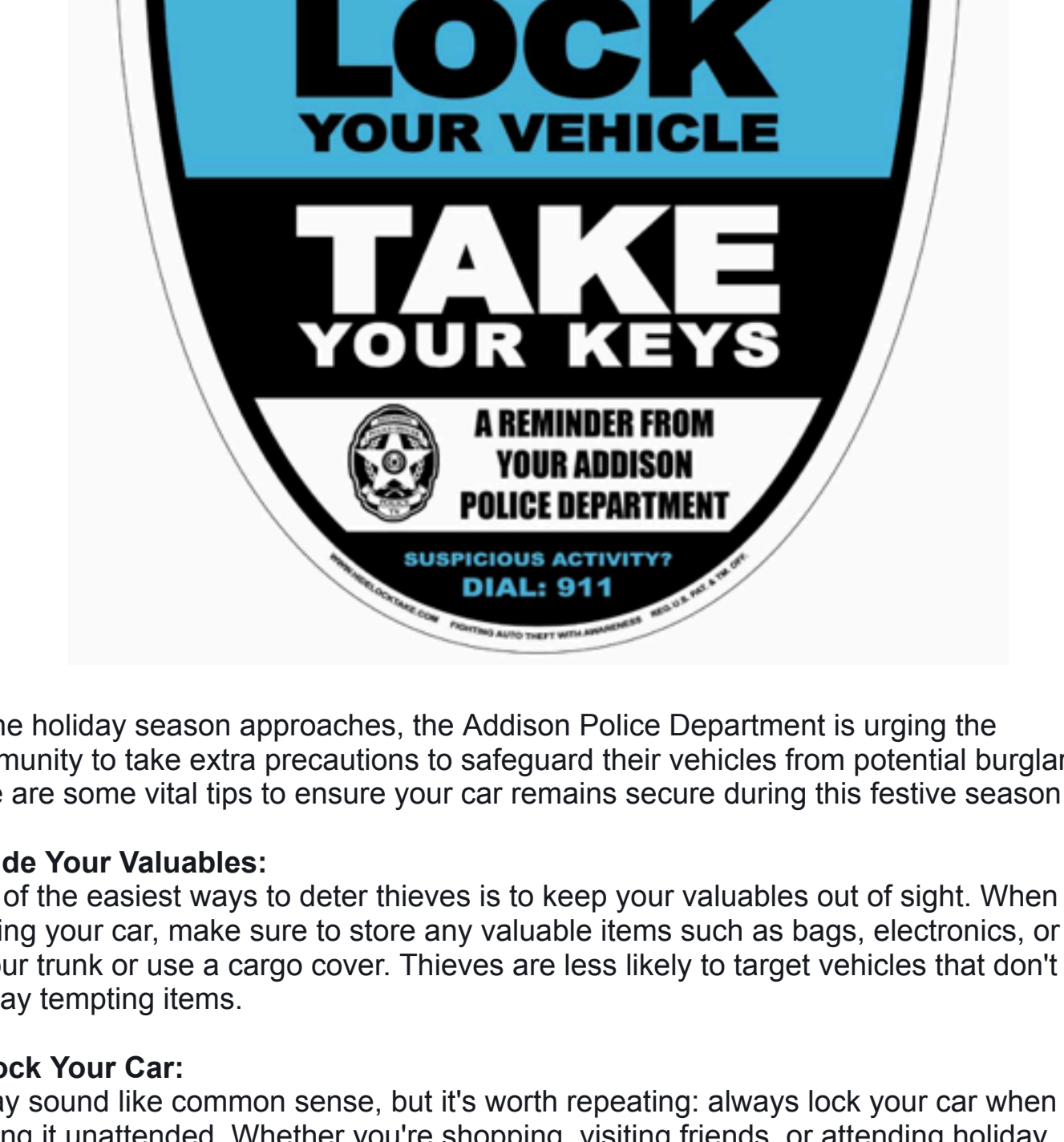

#### Hide Lock Take this Holiday Season and Beyond



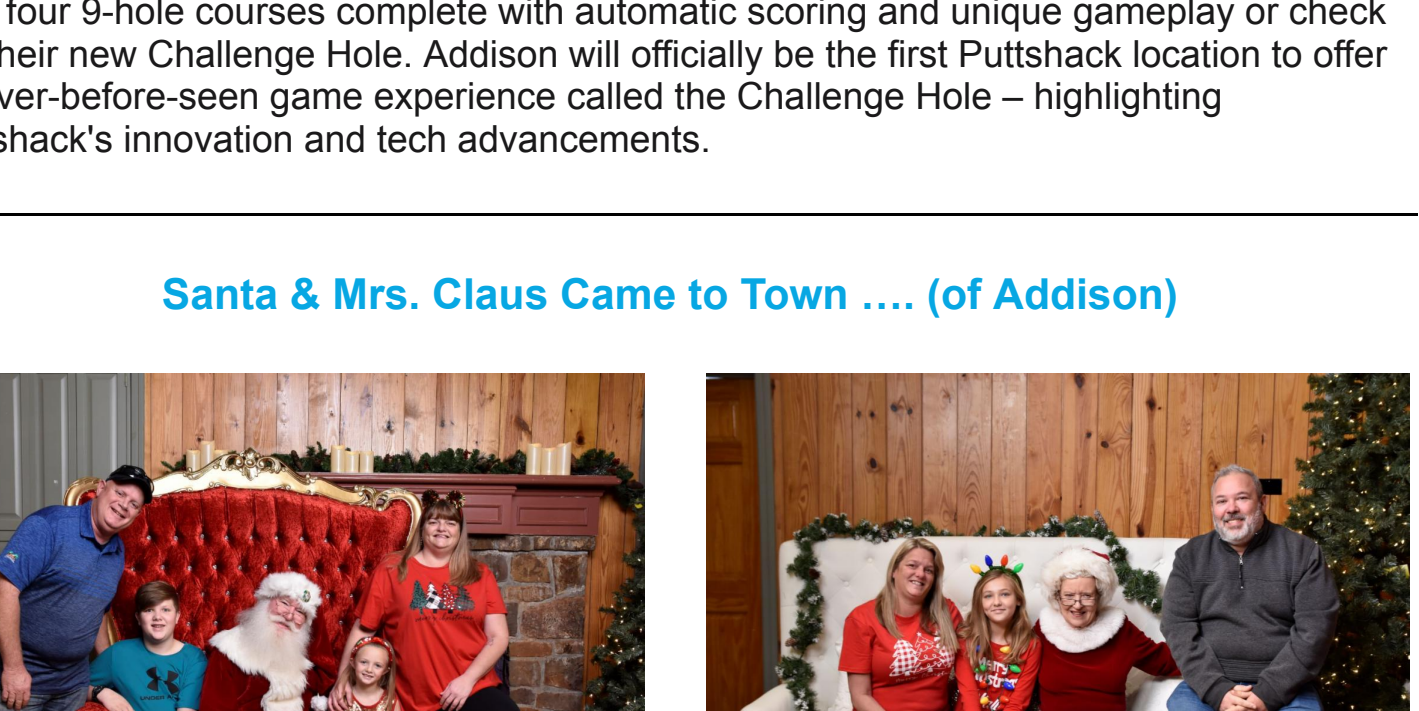
As the holiday season approaches, the Addison Police Department is urging the community to take extra precautions to safeguard their vehicles from potential burglaries. Here are some vital tips to ensure your car remains secure during this festive season.

- 1. Hide Your Valuables:** One of the easiest ways to deter thieves is to keep your valuables out of sight. When parking your car, make sure to store any valuable items such as bags, electronics, or gifts in your trunk or use a cargo cover. Thieves are less likely to target vehicles that don't display tempting items.
- 2. Lock Your Car:** It may sound like common sense, but it's worth repeating: always lock your car when leaving it unattended. Whether you're shopping, visiting friends, or attending holiday gatherings, taking a moment to secure your vehicle can make all the difference.

#### Rotary Clubs Present Check for Santa's Heroes

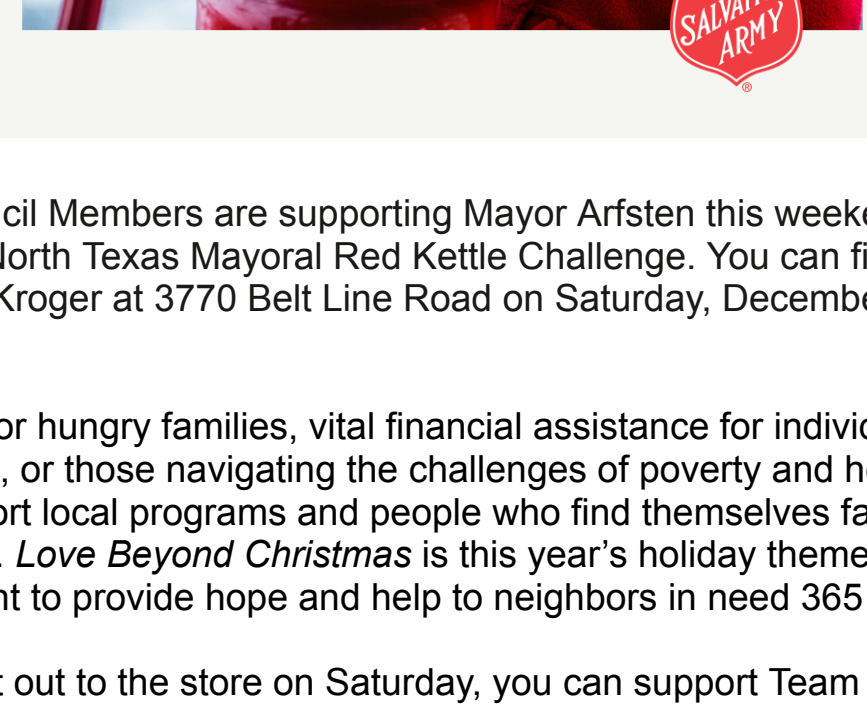

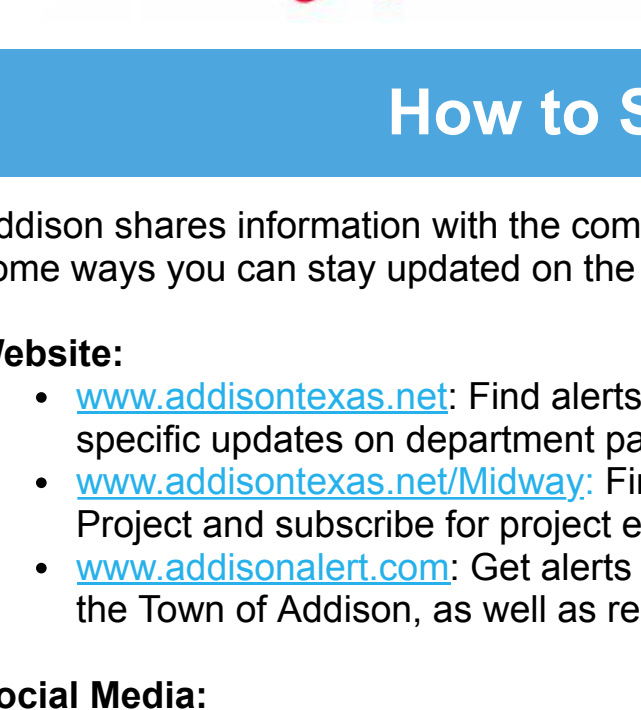
