
Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)



- The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program was started by the FBI to develop a system of consistent police crime statistics across the nation based on population.
 - Part 1 offenses are the following 7 offenses: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and theft of motor vehicles.
- UCR statistics can give a brief comparison of major crime across the country over time. However, many categories of crime were excluded from UCR such as financial crime, cyber crime, and crimes relating to public safety.
 - Any lesser crimes or arrests from the same incident were also not counted.
- 2019 was the last year Addison submitted UCR data to the FBI. Comparative statistics for other cities and states will now be formatted as NIBRS data.

National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS)



 The Addison Police Department began reporting our crime statistics to the State of Texas and to the FBI using the NIBRS format in 2020 – these categories are split into groups A and B

Group A contains:

- All 7 of the classic UCR Part 1 offenses plus an additional 45 offenses.
- These 52 offenses are sorted into three categories: crimes against persons, crimes against property, and crimes against society.

Group B contains:

- Arrestable offenses including criminal trespass, alcohol offenses, and disorderly conduct.
- Offenses that do not fall in any other category are also included in Group B.

Benefits of NIBRS



Provides greater specificity in reporting offenses

- NIBRS not only looks at look at all the offenses within an incident, but it also looks at many more offenses than the traditional SRS does.
- NIBRS collects data for 52 offenses, plus 10 additional offenses for which only arrests are reported.
- SRS counts limited data for 10 offenses and 20 additional crimes for which only arrests are reported.
- Collects more detailed information, including, but not limited to*:
 - Incident date and time
 - Whether reported offenses were attempted or completed
 - Expanded victim types
 - Relationships of victims to offenders and offenses
 - Demographic details
- Helps give context to specific crime problems, such as:
 - Drugs/narcotics
 - Sex offenses
 - Animal cruelty related issues
 - Identity theft
 - Computer hacking
- Provides greater analytic flexibility
 - Through NIBRS, data users can see many more facets of crime, as well as relationships and connections among these facets, than
 what SRS provides.
